THE 4 HOURS OF IMOLA WILL SEE 22 LMP2 CARS IN ACTION, THE LARGEST GRID OF LMP2S IN THE WORLD.



The ELMS returns to Imola The /I Hours of Imola will be contested by 22 I MP2 cars. 1/Lin I MP2 and 8 in I MP2 Pro/

The 4 Hours of Imola will be contested by 22 LMP2 cars, 14 in LMP2 and 8 in LMP2 Pro/Am, the largest gathering of the class of Le Mans Prototypes anywhere in the world. In addition, there are 10 LMP3s and 11 LMGT3s, with each car fighting for class honours on the full 4.9km track here at the Autodromo Internazionale Enzo e Dino Ferrari.

There will be 128 drivers and 28 teams representing 30 different nations, with 4 teams and 7 drivers racing under the Italian flag. It is also the first race since many of the teams and drivers took part in the 92nd edition of the 24 Hours of Le Mans last month, which saw Ferrari secure their second overall victory in a row.

Nicklas Nielsen stood on the top step of the podium with his Ferrari teammates Miguel Molina and Antonio Fucco to celebrate a hard-fought victory at Le Mans. Nicklas Nielsen will be racing this weekend in the Formula Racing Ferrari 296 LMGT3 at the track that bears the name of the founder of the world's most famous sportscar manufacturer.

The LMP2 driver's list is an impressive array of champions and race winners from every disciple of motor sport and includes Italian drivers Matteo Cairoli, Luca Ghiotto, Alessio Rovera and Giorgio Roda. With top international drivers such as Robert Kubica, Felipe Drugovich, Louis Deletraz, Paul Di Resta, Frederik Vesti, Will Stevens, Oliver Jarvis and many others, the ELMS LMP2 grid is the most competitive in the history of the series.

LMP3 is the junior Le Mans Prototype category with teams choosing to use either the Ligier JS P320 or Duqueine M30-D08 chassis, all powered by the same Nissan V8 engine. The driver line ups on the 10-car strong LMP3 grid are a mixture of professional and amateur drivers, with many of the stars of the future choosing to compete in LMP3 as the first step on the long ladder to the 24 Hours of Le Mans.

Eleven cars will contest the LMGT3 category and will see Ferrari, Aston Martin, Porsche, and Lamborghini go head-to-head, with three Italian teams – AF Corse, Iron Lynx and Iron Dames – and three Italian drivers – Matteo Cressoni, Riccardo Pera and Davide Rigon.

The open paddock extends a warm welcome to all the fans and invites them to get up close to the cars and drivers while continuing to demonstrate the professionalism that surrounds top level endurance racing.



The initial categorisation is based on the **driver's age** and **career record**. This may be adjusted in subsequent seasons according to the recorded **race pace** and **results** of the series.

LMP2

A crew of 2 or 3 drivers must include at least one Silver or Bronze driver.

Two Platinium drivers can't be entered in the same line up.

LMP3

A crew of 3 drivers must be made of as the following:

- 1 Gold and 2 Bronze drivers
- 2 Silver and 1 Bronze drivers
- 3 Bronze or Silver (including 1 Bronze minimum)

A crew of 2 drivers must be made of as the following:

- 1 Bronze and 1 Silver drivers - 2 Bronze drivers

LMP2 PRO/AM

A crew of 2 or 3 drivers must include at least one Bronze driver. Two Platinium drivers cannot be entered in the same line up.

LMGT3

A crew of 2 or 3 drivers must include at least one Bronze and one Silver driver or two Bronze drivers.



LE MANS PROTOTYPE 2

The LMP2 is a racing car with no production minimum required. It allows teams, as well as drivers, to gradually progress to the highest level. It is a closed cockpit car, destined only to teams independent of manufacturers

and/or engine suppliers. Because of their superior performances and level of technological development, they have a star status within endurance racing.







NICKLAS NIELSEN: 24 HOURS OF LE MANS CHAMPION WITH

race since that win is in Italy that bears the name of Enzo Ferrari.

FERRARI

The 27-year-old driver from Horning in Jutland has had a meteoric rise since winning the WSK Champions Cup in karts.

In 2018 he won the Ferrari Challenge title, followed by the ELMS LMGTE title in 2019. He switched to the FIA World Endurance Championship the following season, winning the LMGTE Am titles in 2020 and 2021.

In 2022 Nielsen switched to Le Mans Prototypes, winning the LMP2 Pro/Am title at his first attempt. In 2023 he became part of the Ferrari AF Corse Hypercar squad finishing third overall in the debut season, and, of course, he has won the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 2024.

Nicklas Nielsen returns to the ELMS this weekend, racing with fellow Danes Johnny and Conrad Laursen in the no50 Formula Racing Ferrari 296 LMGT3. The Danish trio won

In 2024, Ferrari did it again, with two cars on the podium. Nicklas Nielsen, Miguel Molina and Antonio Fucco celebrating in true motorsport style in one of the most competitive races in the 101-year history of the world's most famous race. It seems very apt that Nielsen's first



Congratulations to you and the rest of the Ferrari AF Corse team on a great result at the 24 Hours of Le Mans. Your name now joins a very elite band of drivers who have won Le Mans, including your fellow Dane and 'Mr Le Mans' Tom Kristensen. How does that feel?

Nicklas Nielsen: "First of all it feels amazing to win. I also feel that the way we won was quite remarkable, so I am very proud to be the next Dane in the line to win this race. Like Tom said, it's a very small club since we are just three. Nevertheless, I'm really proud to join this exclusive club. Not only of Danish

drivers but in general.

"Many people race their whole life to win in Le Mans and for me to win it in the second year of the Hypercar with Ferrari is something that I am really very proud of."

The 24 Hours of Le Mans was a very difficult and competitive race this year. How did it go from your perspective?

NN: "The race was very, very tricky. The circumstances and track conditions were horrible at one point. I know for the spectators it must've been quite boring

during the long safety car period that we had. It was a long period but, in the end, it was necessary because, first of all, we couldn't see anything as is always the case in rain. When we start not being able to go on the straight without risky to lose the cars, this is something completely different. It was a tough race but that's why I think the victory was even better for US."

What was the view and the feeling from the top step of that very famous podium?

NN: "It was incredible and quite difficult to describe as well. I felt very lucky to be in the position I was in, being in a car that could win. Doing it with Ferrari and for the second year in a row we took the top step and with the no51 on the podium as well. Last year was amazing for the team but for us in the 50 car this is exactly what we needed after a season with very good pace but some unlucky situations. So for us to take the victory and to be celebrated on the podium with so many people around was incredible."

We now head to the Imola, the Autodromo Enzo e Dino Ferrari. After winning Le Mans with Ferrari does it make your ELMS return extra special racing in a Ferrari in Italy?

NN: "Whenever we race in Italy there is great support and I'm looking forward to going to Imola and sharing the car with Johnny and Conrad, two very important people for me. Johnny was the one who opened the door, together with Amato (Ferrari), to go into Ferrari. So, to share car with him and with his son Conrad, who I used to coach in karting, is something I am very happy to do.

"The results are good, we won in Barcelona, and we are a very strong team together. I'm very honoured to be able to share these experiences with them."





You've also won in the ELMS this season in Spain, finishing first alongside fellow Danes Johnny and Conrad Laursen in the Formula Racing Ferrari 296 LMGT3. How would you sum up your season so far in the ELMS?

NN: "I think we've had a strong season so far with the win in Barcelona. Our goal for the season is to try and win the championship. I want to see Johnny and Conrad back in Le Mans next year as well, so that's the goal for me. I feel we have a good chance but it's always difficult to predict. However, we are in good position with a good car and a good team behind us, so we are in good position to do well in Imola and in the championship."

You've already raced in Imola this season in the WEC, finishing the six-hour race in fourth place last April. What are your thoughts on the circuit in Imola and what is your favourite part of the track?

NN: "Imola is one of the coolest tracks we have on the calendar. I think my favourite part of the track is going down into Acque

Minerali, but it is very difficult to choose just one corner or one section.

"I think the track in terms of layout, in terms of corners, speed and so on is very complete. It's a very narrow track, which makes it difficult to pass. It's also interesting to race there, especially with the Hypercar, trying to manage the traffic with the GTs. Obviously, it's going to be the same in the ELMS, but it's the other way around for me this weekend, but Imola always brings out some competitive racing."

You've already raced in Imola this season in the WEC, finishing the six-hour race in fourth place last How difficult is it to change from racing the Ferrari 499P Hypercar to the 296 LMGT3? How do you adapt as a driver?


NN: "It's actually not a big deal to be honest. The cars are very different. It does take a few laps to get back into the rhythm but it's not something I am thinking about or finding difficult. I'm the type of guy who just loves racing, so I am just happy to race in whatever car. If it's the 499P I'm

happy to go on track and if it's the 296 I'm happy to go as well. I always do my best in whatever car I am driving."

The LMGT3 category in the ELMS is ultra-competitive this season. Who do you see as your main rivals in Imola?

NN: "I think Porsche has been really strong so far, so I would say that they are our main rivals. But it's funny that when you think someone is your closest rivals then somebody else shows up. That's the beauty of our racing, it's always a bit unpredictable in testing and qualifying and you don't really know where you are until the race starts, and it's the same every year.

"However, looking at the results so far, and also the speed of the cars, I would say that Porsche is lightly ahead of us but I do believe that we have the best car in terms of race pace. Qualifying is always important of course and Johnny did a good job in Barcelona, so I am sure we can fight for another top result in Imola."
