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**Ingredient comments:** The mineral oils in the product contain <3% DMSO extract(IP 346).

### SECTION 4: First aid measures

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

- Inhalation:** Seek fresh air. Seek medical advice in case of persistent discomfort.
- Ingestion:** Wash out mouth thoroughly and drink 1-2 glasses of water in small sips. Seek medical advice in case of persistent discomfort.

### SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

#### 5.1. Extinguishing media

- Suitable extinguishing media:** Extinguish with powder, foam or water mist. Use water or water mist to cool non-ignited stock.

#### 5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Not flammable, but combustible. Product decomposes in fire conditions or when heated to high temperatures, and inflammable and toxic gases may be released.

#### 5.3. Advice for firefighters

Wear Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) with a chemical protection suit only where personal (close) contact is likely. Wear gloves.

#### 6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

- For non-emergency personnel:** Wear safety goggles if there is a risk of eye splash. Wear gloves. Stay upwind/keep distance from source. Stop leak if this can be done without risk. Keep unnecessary personnel away. Wear suitable protective clothing.
- For emergency responders:** In addition to the above: Protective suit equivalent to EN 368, type 3, is recommended.

Contain and absorb spill with sand or other absorbent material and transfer to suitable waste containers. Wipe up minor spills with a cloth.

## SECTION 7: Handling and storage

### 7.1. Precautions for safe handling

Running water and eye wash equipment must be available. Wash hands before breaks, before using restroom facilities, and at the end of work.
