**Ingredient comments:** The mineral oils in the product contain <3% DMSO extract(IP 346).

### SECTION 4: First aid measures

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

<b>Inhalation:</b>	Seek fresh air.
<b>Ingestion:</b>	Wash out mouth thoroughly and drink 1-2 glasses of water in small sips. Seek medical advice in case of discomfort.

#### 4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

May cause slight irritation to the skin and eyes. The product contains at least one substance which is a suspected reproductive hazard.

Not flammable, but combustible. Can generate harmful flue gases containing carbon monoxide in the event of fire.

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### 6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

**For emergency responders:** In addition to the above: Normal protective clothing equivalent to EN 469 is recommended.

### 7.1. Precautions for safe handling
