The Low Carbon Food City project is a partnership approach to climate action through food systems change. The project builds on years of excellent work carried out by the community food sector, and is framed around key actions in the new Glasgow City Food Plan. It will enable communities to be actively involved in creating a sustainable, fair and healthy food future, ensuring participation from the ground up.

Core themes of the project are community participation, urban agriculture, food education, campaigning, and COP26.

The Project Coordinator will support delivery of the Low Carbon Food City project by working with partners to develop innovative approaches that help deliver outcomes and outputs. Specifically, this role will take a lead on driving forward the urban agriculture ambitions, in addition to other project tasks.

This post is part of a team structure, and will work cooperatively with the Project Manager, Community Activators and Project Support Officer.

This unique project is delivered in partnership with GCFN, Urban Roots, Glasgow Eco Trust, St Paul's Youth Forum, The Space, and Central and West Integration Network. The project is funded through the National Lottery Climate Action Fund

## **Job Description**

- Work with partners to develop plans for upscaling urban agriculture, key liaison between land owners and stakeholders.
- Lead on development of community food sector mapping community growing spaces, food education projects, food hubs, pantries etc...
- Providing consistent support to the partnership by facilitating learning and sharing opportunities, back office duties and internal communications.
- Collate relevant research and best practice around sustainable food systems and carbon reductions through food systems change, to share with partners and inform project delivery.
- Work with partners to develop Peer Budgeting programme, to implement in year 2.

### In addition:

- Provide support and supervision to the Community Activators.
- Seek new opportunities for spin-off projects and resources to implement them.
- Apply for additional funds to support project delivery.
