The role

Key tasks

- Organising of the certification of the canal boat;
- Management of the day to day running of the boat including finance and bookings;
- Arranging and delivering events involving the canal boat;
- Ensuring compliance with all laws and regulations;
- Managing and training volunteers and service users involved in the project;
- Scheduling inspections, pump outs and other routine maintenance activities as are reasonably necessary to keep the canal boat in good, working and safe condition;
- Carrying out such other day to day activities as are required for the effective operation of the project.
