Participants engage in skills development courses through which we better life chances by awarding qualifications and create person centred pathways back into education, or on into further education, training and employment.

Heavy Sound now wants to recruit a teacher to take our young people through SQA qualifications, mostly National 2, 3 and 4 primarily in literacy and numeracy, with other subjects to be agreed by discussion. The role will involve working with local schools to identify the best educational pathways for our young people.
