- Contribute to the delivery of a wider Active Travel activity model as and when required.
- Contribute to the strategic development of the Community Outreach Department and wider organisation.
- Assist with the coordination and delivery of community based events.
- Monitor and evaluate the social impact of the programme.
- Produce detailed quarterly reports for the project funder.
- Supporting and implementing behaviour change programmes under supervision of the Active Travel Lead at Bike for Good, Cycling Scotland's BC Manager and with the support of the Community Outreach Team.
- Support the development of case studies from notable Cycling Friendly organisations.
