

Job Description: Youth Justice Participation Worker

Background:

Established in 1998, Staf (Scottish Throughcare and Aftercare Forum) is a membership organisation for all those working with young people leaving care. Staf is a national organisation which represents all 32 Local authorities in Scotland and is funded by membership fees, Scottish Government and other major charities. At the centre of all our work is the voice of young people leaving care and making the change that will allow them to live happy successful lives on their own terms.

Thanks to funding from the Promise, this is an exciting opportunity to use your youth work skills to influence change and amplify the voice of care experienced young people within the justice systems by supporting us to expand Youth Justice Voices into a national network, with a specific focus on establishing youth-led steering groups beyond the central belt.

Main Function:

To engage with young people with experience of the care and justice systems in order to amplify their voice and support systems change. To work collaboratively with Youth Justice Voices staff, young people and partner agencies to expand the work of the project into a national network.

Specific Duties:

Under the guidance of the Youth Justice Participation Lead at Staf:

- 1. Establish a steering group of young people to act as advisors to the project outwith the central belt.
- 2. Ensure that young people are involved in all aspects of planning and development of the project.



- 3. Work across Scotland to innovatively gather the views of care experienced young people involved in the justice system.
- 4. Develop an ongoing feedback and evaluation loop to ensure learning is shared widely.
- 5. Feed the views of young people into the wider work of Staf and CYCJ.
- 6. Attend youth justice related meetings to comment on practice and policy based on the experiences of children and young people.
- 7. Contribute to training and practice development activities to share the views of children and young people.
- 8. Help to identify policy and practice improvements based on young people's experiences.
