Garden & Volunteer Wellbeing Coordinator Walled Garden, Linburn, West Lothian

For over 50 years, Cyrenians (a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO), registered charity number SC011052) has served those on the edge; working with the homeless and those at risk to transform their lives.

Our Vision is an inclusive society in which we all have the opportunities to live valued and fulfilled lives. We work to make that vision a reality though our Mission to support people excluded from family, home, work or community on their life journey.

We aim to offer consistently excellent service across all locations and in all our activities. Our way of working is built on our four core values:

Compassion: We believe that everyone should have the chance to change, no matter how long that might take.

Respect: We believe in tolerance, acceptance, valuing diversity and treating each other as equals.

Integrity: We are committed to the highest quality of work, grounded in honesty, generosity, sincerity and professionalism.

Innovation: We are willing to take risks, challenge convention and be very creative in our search for new ways of working, in particular by taking account of the environmental impact of our decisions.

1 General

Cyrenians is in the process of signing a three-year lease with Sight Scotland to manage and develop the walled garden at Linburn, West Lothian. The site is 5,000 square meters and already grows a variety of herbs, wild garlic, orchids and vegetables. This site offers great potential for further development as we look to expand on our seasonal growing and a range of wellbeing nature-based activities. Cyrenians are the lead partner in Live Life which is a partnership working together to help veterans and their families and carers with their mental and physical health. We will be looking to build a cob oven and offer arts and craft activities as well as cultivating a new bee hive. The garden is well positioned and in an accessible location close to Cyrenians' farm, Sight Scotland Linburn Centre, the Military Museum Scotland and Wilkieston Legion Hall.

Cyrenians has secured funding to transform the walled garden which has retained many original features and stonework. This garden project will offer existing and future work with veterans and their families as well as people and groups from the local community. In addition, we will develop and provide a range of therapeutic activities in the garden for Veterans and their families. Activities include: gardening, landscaping, producing food to share and for sale, increasing the bio-diversity of the garden, nature-based arts and crafts and a wide range of therapeutic learning programmes and social events.

We look to do this through:

- developing and maintaining a high quality, sustainable therapeutic walled garden;
- providing a range of gardening and nature-based activities for veterans/ families, volunteers, visitors and groups;
- working in partnership with Live Life & Scottish Veterans Wellbeing alliance and other veteran hubs.

The main outcomes expected for the Garden & Volunteer Wellbeing Coordinator role are:

- Develop and implement growing plans and vision for the garden with input from gardens colleagues and volunteers
- Recruit, induct and support garden volunteers
- Ensure operations are well-organised, safely managed and delivered
- Plan and deliver infrastructure projects and taking the garden forward
- Working with our partners to help promote and engage with wellbeing activitie

By the very nature of this being a gardening role there will be physically demanding aspects i.e. digging, lifting and bending

2 Tasks and Responsibilities

Ensure the garden is adequately planted during all seasons, and that a programme of activity is in place

- Facilitate the smooth running of activities in the garden ensuring they are productive, attractive, and pleasant spaces for people to socialise and gather
- Lead the development of the land and facilities with input from colleagues and volunteers
- Prioritise and time-manage short and long-term growing projects and developments
- Maintain a productive year-round vegetable and herb garden
- Work with colleagues and staff to organise and facilitate seasonal events in the garden
- Develop opportunities for food sharing and building and using cob oven in the garden

The garden also offers the opportunity to develop income-generating activity along side the farm through social enterprise that will contribute to the running cost.

Provide assistance to individuals taking part in partner lead activities.
 Maintain attendance records and other monitoring and evaluation mechanisms relating to volunteers.
