In the last year Cancer Support Scotland has offered over 6,500 appointments and demand for our services is continuing to rise.






Our Values


Our Governance Structure:

The role of Trustee

Trustees play a critical role in the governance and running of an organisation.

This role will involve partnership with other members of the Cancer Support Scotland Board and members of staff. Trustees help shape Cancer Support Scotland's strategy, policy and objectives which makes this an exciting time to be a Trustee as we move into our next chapter. Trustees will scrutinise workplans and steward the resources of the organisation.

Key Responsibilities

Strategic Leadership - to lead the development and implementation of the organisation's strategy

Governance – to encourage high standards of governance and promote the efficient and effective use of staff and other resources throughout the organisation.

External Communications – to work with the CEO in the organisation's key relationships

The CEO and Management


- Provide support and leadership to the CEO, ensuring Cancer Support Scotland is run in accordance with the decisions of the Board, values of the organisation and good governance

- To advocate on behalf of Cancer Support Scotland at public events as appropriate and with the media where required;
