Job Title: Health Project Worker

About Ama-zing harmonies

Ama-zing Harmonies is a registered Scottish charity aimed to improve community health in Edinburgh. The organisation focuses particularly on minority health and inclusion, offering activities for mental health through workshops, arts, cultural activities, and community awareness events, as well as physical health through sports activities and healthy food relief programmes. We additionally offer an intergenerational community music group which functions as a core bridge to the community allowing participants to share in cross-cultural art, and improve well-being.

At Ama-zing harmonies we take an approach to HIV, Hepatitis C and Sexual. We work closely with communities, starting conversations about these issues, encouraging people to access testing and empowering them to make choices that improve their health and well-being.

We're also here for people living with HIV or hepatitis B&C, working with them to understand their needs and offering practical support that helps them to live well.

Everything we do is guided by the experiences of the people we work with. By sharing these experiences, along with information people can trust, we want to challenge the stigma associated with HIV, hepatitis C and sexual health, and address the broader inequalities that our communities face.

About the post:

To provide support services for people living with Blood Borne Viruses (BBVs) in Falkirk. The post holder will be part of a team working with those at higher risk of BBV transmission such as specific services for people who inject drugs and for local African communities.

This role will particularly emphasize supporting people from local African communities on issues directly related to their HIV status (for example treatment adherence issues, disengagement, formula feeding to avoid transmission to children, etc.).

About the person:

- A demonstrable interest in, and passion for, improving the lives of people affected by blood-borne viruses.
- Excellent interpersonal skills and the ability to develop positive relationships with a range of
 - Stakeholders.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills appropriate for a wide range of audiences.

Main duties and responsibilities:

1. Provide one-to-one emotional support to service users to identify and overcome barriers to

improving their health and well-being.

- 2. Facilitate opportunities for one-to-one and group peer support.
- 3. Work with faith groups and faith leaders to promote sexual health education in churches and other faith organisations.
- 4. Give sexual health seminars in churches, and community groups and carry out tests for blood-borne viruses (training will be provided)
- 5. Promote the value of testing and knowing your Blood Borne Virus (BBV) status.
- 6. Deliver BBV and sexual health advice and support.
- 7. Record and keep up-to-date records of all client interventions.
- 8. Work with other members of the team to provide required plans and reports to our funders.
- 9. To work effectively with a range of partners in the local area including health colleagues and

others in voluntary and statutory sector services.

- 10. To participate in a system of support and supervision.
- 11. Undertake any other duties, which may be reasonably required.
- Participate in Ama-zing Harmonie's activities as requested.

Training for these roles will be provided however, a working knowledge is essential.
