

JOB DESCRIPTION:

Community Engagement Worker (Youth) (PART-TIME)

Hours: 20 hours per week, Monday to Thursday evenings (please see current youth activity schedule, below) with development time to be worked flexibly in line with the needs of the organisation. During school holiday periods, hours will be worked as and when required in development and support of youth holiday programmes. Occasional weekend working may also be necessary.

<u>Period Of Contract</u>: Permanent role, subject to funding and successful completion of a 6-month probationary period

<u>Main Purpose of Job</u>: To deliver the youth engagement programme at the Beatroute Arts Centre and to work under the advisement of the Project Manager in the planning and development of all member-led activities.

Main Tasks and Responsibilities:

- Acting as lead engagement worker for all youth engagement activities at Beatroute Arts.
- Acting as a point of contact for the youth community engagement programme.
- Acting as one of a team of key-holders for the organisation, opening and closing as necessary for community engagement activities.
- Planning, setting up and leading on practical youth engagement activities (such as arts and crafts, gardening, games etc) and ensuring safe use of equipment for the duration of activities.
- Ensuring that all members are registered using Beatroute Arts member registration process and collating all registration information on our central information system.

- Supporting the Management Team in the development of partnerships and delivery of partnership work.
- Being responsible for set pieces of work, including the running of events, as directed by the Beatroute Arts Management Team.
- Engaging with members, family members and carers to identify preferred group activities in keeping with the organisations community-led ethos.
- Working with the Management Team to generate evaluation data, collating as required and feeding into the ongoing reporting to funders.
- Working to uphold the mission, values and reputation of Beatroute Arts, always acting as an advocate for the organisation.
- Any other task as required by the management team.

Essential:

- 1. Experience of engaging a diverse range of young people and a commitment to empowering young people through community-led practice
- 2. An outgoing and confident approach to working with large groups of young people, ensuring a safe and productive learning environment
- 3. Ability to work well as part of a small team as well as on own initiative.
- 4. Ability to communicate clearly and effectively
- 5. A highly organised work ethos, and ability to prioritise tasks
- 6. Availability and willingness to work in the evening
- 7. Experience of using Microsoft packages, ie: Microsoft Word/Excel

Desirable:

- 1. Be trained in and have experience of the basics of evaluation, including data gathering and collation
- 2. Previous safeguarding training and awareness of best practice.
