

- To deliver direct youth work to LGBTI young people through youth group programmes and through individual one to one support
- To work as part of the Youth Work Team to participate in events, projects and community development activities
- To work in partnership with key local stakeholders and to be responsible for the development of our work with LGBTI young people, groups and networks in the West
