#### **North Lanarkshire Routes additional information**

Working as a delivery partner for Scottish Families, Barnardos will deliver North Lanarkshire Routes across the local authority to children and young people aged 12 -26 years who are affected by a family members substance use. Regular evening and weekend work is required.

In addition to the above applicants should:

- Hold a full driving license and have access to a car for the purposes of work.
- Have a minimum Qualification NVQ 2 in health and social care (or equivalent).
- Demonstrate an ability to build rapport, and positively engage and support young people.
- Understand and work alongside national and local policy to tackle and reduce alcohol and drug related harms.
- Demonstrate an ability to build rapport, positively engage and support children and young people.
- Have experience of developing, delivering, and facilitating group work programmes

**It is desirable but not essential for the successful candidate to have:**

- Community based youth work experience.
- Experience of supporting young people to engage in planning, developing, and evaluating projects.
- Awareness of organisations within North Lanarkshire that provide support to children, young people, and families.
- Understand the policy and legislation affecting children, young people and families.
- Have a working knowledge of the issues facing young people affected by drugs and alcohol.

**Responsibilities (in addition to the above)**

- To support and deliver the North Lanarkshire Routes Project
- To develop a programme of group work activities
- To arrange transport to and from activities
- To support young people's emotional development, allowing them to increase their self esteem and confidence whilst helping them to identify and maximise their strengths.
