## **JOB PURPOSE**

The successful candidate will work closely with the YSCS Director, Board of Trustees and partners to coordinate and implement our transformative project, which aims to empower young people aged 16-25 to engage with and influence marine policy issues that impact their lives and communities.

## **MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 5) Act as a point of contact for young volunteers, answering queries, providing support and guidance, and ensuring they receive the necessary resources and information.

- 7) Ensuring compliance with relevant policies & procedures
- 8) Be adaptable to other tasks that fall within the scope of this position
