Job Purpose



What you'll do

- Undertake research, surveys and consult with older people to identify their views and experiences on a wide range of issues.
- Prepare policy statements, briefings, and consultation responses for the Scottish government, Scottish Parliament, local councils and other relevant bodies or organisations.
- Monitor and horizon scan national and local policy developments for opportunities to influence positive change for older people.
- Work with colleagues to ensure policy work is translated into effective influencing and campaigns.
- Develop and update policy positions through desk-based research and in consultation with older people, colleagues and external partners.
- Work with older people to ensure their voice and experiences are heard by policy-makers.
- Support the charity's media activity with analysis of policy developments and issues.
- Work with the Head of Policy and Communications to commission research and polling, project manage this work and budgets.
- Represent Age Scotland at external meetings and events.
- Develop and maintain a network of key partners and stakeholders, and collaborate with policy colleagues at Age UK, Cymru and Northern Ireland.



What you'll bring

- Experience in policy development and research is essential.
- Strong knowledge and interest of a range of policy areas affecting older people in Scotland.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills, with a demonstrable ability to write clearly, concisely and persuasively, summarising complex information swiftly and accurately for a variety of audiences.
- A strong understanding of the workings of the Scottish Parliament and Government, and how the charity sector can influence them.
- Strong analytical and statistical skills.
- Experience of partnership building and managing relationships.
- An understanding of working with older people.
- An ability to work well as part of a team, support colleagues, and be a selfstarter who can meet deadlines and a fast pace of work.
