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# The Opportunity

Reporting to the Director of Finance and Operations, the Financial Controller will have day to day responsibility for a small finance team whilst enjoying regular interaction with the CEO, the Artistic Director, the Finance Committee and the Board of Trustees.

As Financial Controller, your primary responsibility will be to provide timeous, regular and high quality financial and management information for the Board to support the decision making process of the Senior Leadership Team. Specifically, your duties will include but not be limited to:

- Production and review of monthly management accounts with detailed commentary and analysis – paying particular attention to key drivers of business performance
- Support the external audit process and the preparation of financial accounts
- Preparation of finance papers for the Board of Trustees and the Audit Committee
- Weekly cashflow forecasting

- Support the Director of Finance with a wide variety of strategic and commercial activities as well as the production of budgets, forecasts and re-forecasts
- Prepare quarterly Board Packs
- Capital Project accounting
- Leadership, management and development of the transactional finance team
- Regular liaison with external stakeholders such as bankers and professional advisors

The role is offered on a full-time basis of 35 hours per week, ideally with 2-3 days per week being office based.

# The Ideal Candidate

In order to be successful, it is anticipated that you will be a fully qualified accountant with post-qualified experience gained in a constantly evolving, cash-focussed organisation.
