What is befriending?

Befriending is a relationship supported by an organisation to enable meaningful connections. The befriending relationship has boundaries. It begins with an organisation matching individuals together and then providing ongoing support to both befriender and service user. The befriending relationship is monitored by the organisation and is supported at all stages, including managing the ending.

Befriending can be diverse in its delivery but shares a common goal of enabling meaningful connections. This connection can be between people with shared or different life experiences. Befriending is a planned social interaction, taking place in 1:1 and small group settings, and can be delivered in person or at a distance.

Befriending will achieve positive outcomes and prevent negative outcomes for individuals and communities. Befriending reduces loneliness and social isolation by increasing meaningful connections. The befriending relationship is nurturing, enriching, and trusting.

Quality in Befriending Award

The Quality in Befriending Award is the only award in the UK specifically tailored for befriending services and is valued by referrers, befrienders, commissioners, and funders. Developed by Befriending Networks in consultation with member organisations and experts in the field of befriending, the award launched in 2010 and was revised and updated in 2021.



The Award is open to services offering befriending of all kinds, supporting everyone from children and young people to older adults. Whether they offer telephone, group, or one-toone befriending, the Quality Award provides organisations with the opportunity to review and improve their service.

Organisations aiming to achieve the Award provide evidence across 60 quality indicators organised into 7 practice areas. These include policies, management, evaluation, and the service journey. The award is valid for 3 years, and organisations successful in achieving the Award can apply for Excellence if they choose to present evidence for an additional 23 indicators. Organisations achieving the Award must be a Befriending Networks member.

Job Purpose

As an Assessor you will take the lead on supporting our members to achieve their Quality in Befriending Award. You will assist them at all stages of their award journey.

The key responsibilities of this role

- Coordinate Quality Award assessments, including undertaking assessments, ensuring that these are delivered to the highest standard and which protects the integrity of the standard. This includes application, registration, project visits, evidence review, stakeholder interviews, assessment, report drafting, report finalisation, and monitoring.
- Coordinate Quality Award re-accreditation assessments within the agreed timelines for existing award holders. This requires evidence review, assessment, report drafting, report finalisation and monitoring.
- To work in partnership with our Quality Award administrator to ensure a coordinated approach to application, payment, communication, and internal recording of award progress.
- Use Moodle and Teams to support the delivery of Quality Awards.
- Establish knowledgeable, trusted and supportive relationships with members at all stages of the Quality Award journey.



All positions within Befriending Networks are expected contribute to appropriately and proportionately to the achievement of our strategic objectives. This may include contributing to our collective team outputs such as supporting our membership, facilitating network events, participating in team meetings and whole team projects, and assisting the CEO as required.

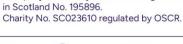
