Overall purpose:

Reporting to the Outdoor Learning and Engagement Manager, to deliver the Public Health and the Outdoors Project of the Heritage Horizons Cairngorms 2030 Programme, funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund and CNPA. To develop the capacity to improve the health of the residents of Badenoch and Strathspey through coordinating and delivering a broad range of initiatives that bring together opportunities to improve health through use of the natural environment.

Responsibilities:

- Assist in the operational delivery of a Green Health Strategic Development plan for NHS Highland
- Design, co-ordinate and deliver multi agency Green Health programmes of work through key strategic partners, including NHS operational units, GPs, community planning partners such as CNPA, Nature Scot, local authorities, third sector organisations and partners in the private and voluntary sectors.
- Increase levels of outdoor access and connection with nature with NHS staff, patients and visitors
- Co-ordinate the delivery of Green Health Link Worker programme activities
- Receive referrals (from healthcare or self referral) to guide patients to Green
 Health opportunities in the Badenoch and Strathspey area; and support access
 to initial participation as appropriate.
- Develop and implement consultation and engagement initiatives to encourage inclusion and inform programme development
- Expand awareness and provision of green health opportunities, with a particular focus on mental health and health inequalities
- Operate as part of the wider CNPA Ranger Service to integrate Green Health outcomes in wider learning and engagement work.
- Provide regular written updates to the Programme Board.

- Contribute to the work of the Planning and Place Directorate and CNPA as a whole and ensuring compliance with financial procedures;
- Contribute to the delivery of the National Park Partnership Plan;
- To conduct other work, as necessary; and
