Job Purpose: Why does the role exist?

The purpose of this role is to lead the teams managing the day to day running of the foodbank, ensuring consistent delivery of core services in the face of increasing levels of demand. This involves immediate line management accountabilities for employed staff and managing the financial and operational management on a day-to-day basis.

Perth and Kinross Foodbank has undergone significant change and development in recent times. The purpose of this role is to lead and support the Perth and Kinross Foodbank workforce (staff and volunteers) to deliver an excellent evolved service for our clients. The Foodbank Operations Manager will manage the day to day undertakings of the Foodbank, overseeing, managing and supporting the Foodbank team to deliver their respective roles and responsibilities which collectively, contribute to our organisational mission, vision and goals. The post holder will also be accountable for IT and systems management, and the monitoring and management of organisational budgets. The role is designed to support the Foodbank Manager in the delivery of the strategic plan.

- Leads the team members to ensure activities are managed so the workforce (both paid staff and volunteers) are clear and supported to deliver their roles through managing performance, capability building, development and any

- Compliments the Foodbank Project Manager to forge a proactive and positive organisational culture.
- Identifies gaps in local service provision and opportunities for growth
- Seeks to foster positive relationships with referral agency partners
- Communicates and ensures the implementation of policies and procedures for example Health and Safety and Data Protection.
- Ensures the appropriate safeguarding and risk management practices are in place and adhered to
- Manages the weekly finances of incoming and outgoing activities ensuring the financial systems (Xero and Hubdoc platforms) are accurate and donations are recorded in a timely manner. and acknowledged
- Owns the budget for building maintenance and repairs as well as staff training and development.
- Responsible for IT and systems management, incorporating new technology to improve effectiveness and increase efficiencies
- Leads on community engagement events, in-store collections and community fundraising initiatives, raising awareness of Perth and Kinross Foodbank and encouraging support for our work.

- Completes operational reporting and contributes to Board reports in advance of meetings. Continuously improve reporting as the new organisational structure embeds.
- Risk management of colleague and client risk
- Update Risk Management Register and identify opportunities to improve and mitigate risks
- Identifies, makes and owns changes where there are opportunities to make improvements.
- Engage with referral agencies and trusted partners to ensure complete and appropriate referrals are made to the Foodbank

- Organise staff training and development opportunities
- Communicate and embed new, amended and existing policies and procedures across the workforce
- Coordinating events, in-store collections and community fundraising initiatives to raise the profile of the Foodbank.
- Manage the operational finance records including daily processing of Xero transactions, updating receipts and invoices on Hubdoc, processing payments, management of petty cash and donations (including Gift Aid and corresponding documentation).
- Collation and submission of monthly payroll information to the Treasurer and bookkeeper for payment
- Manage IT systems and processes to ensure the effective delivery of core Foodbank functions.
- Conduct work in line with Perth and Kinross Foodbank organisational policies and procedures, for example implementation of, and compliance with, Perth and Kinross Foodbank Health and Safety Policy.
