Job Purpose Summary

The Chief Executive of NatureScot has the pivotal role in achieving nature recovery across Scotland, steering the organisation's long-term success and the delivery of key outcomes in the service of Scotlish Government and the people of Scotland. The postholder will provide strategic leadership, drive a positive, inclusive organisational culture, and build strong, positive relationships with partners and stakeholders. They will ensure the organisation optimises the value of its assets, translating policy and ambition into meaningful, impactful action that delivers a range of public benefits.

The post holder will be a strategic leader, able to engage internally and externally to drive long-term progress and identify opportunities to realise the full contribution NatureScot can make to Scotland's nature, people and economy.

They will lead NatureScot's work to enhance our natural environment and inspire the people of Scotland to care more about it. Working closely with Scottish Government and a wide range of partners and stakeholders, they will build consensus and deliver on the vital role that nature-based solutions can contribute to tackling the twinned nature and climate emergencies.

They will play a proactive and positive role in influencing others to help NatureScot realise the full potential of Scotland's natural capital and growing nature finance opportunities.

Closing the finance gap for nature in Scotland for the next decade and leveraging responsible private investment through innovative new partnerships will be vital to meeting climate targets and restoring our natural environment.

The post holder will lead, and be supported by, a Senior Leadership Team, reporting to a Board of Non-Executive Directors in respect of overall strategy. Delivery will be guided by an Audit and Risk Committee for governance and audit purposes, and by a Scientific Advisory Committee on science and evidence matters.

The post holder will be the Accountable Officer responsible for a significant and diverse budget of £89.2m (for 2025/26), incorporating major programmes, including the significant Nature Restoration Fund and PeatlandAction funding.

The post holder will have responsibility for the productivity and wellbeing of around eight hundred people in the organisation, based across the length and breadth of Scotland.

In addition, and importantly, they will be responsible for maintaining an overview of the significant assets held by the organisation, including up to 35,000 hectares of land in 39 locations owned and managed by NatureScot. They range from the largest site, Rum, which is just over 10,000 hectares, to small reserves such as the eight hectares at Rhynie Chert.




