Youth work and training

- Deliver some of Youth Scotland's existing training programmes to youth workers and young people. Train the trainers will be provided to support any onward delivery including workshops from our:
 - Trusted Adult programme of short courses to support young people's health and wellbeing
 - o Ready for Youth Work Intro to youth work programme
 - o Y2 be our young people's mental health and wellbeing programme



- Support and promote the delivery of Youth Scotland's awards as part of our training offer.
- Deliver events for youth workers, volunteers, and young leaders.
- Monitor, evaluate and report on all activities and programmes delivered.
- Promote Youth Scotland's CPD opportunities.
- Provide updates, information, and articles for Youth Scotland communications.
- Maintain youth work values and youth work approach.
