Post Title: Children's Resilience Worker

Purpose

To provide one-to-one, peer based and group work support to mothers, children and families experiencing substance use, domestic abuse and complex mental health challenges. The role focuses on building resilience, promoting positive relationships, and supporting families to make sustainable changes

Key Responsibilities

- 1. Work directly with children and young people to strengthen resilience and build on their strengths.
- 2. Support parents/carers to enhance their parenting capacity and strengthen family relationships, working closely with the Senior Family Outreach Worker and Therapeutic Counsellor.
- 3. Plan, deliver, and review individual, peer, and group work programmes tailored to identified needs.
- 4. Provide training and awareness sessions on the work of the project to external professionals, contributing to good practice and contract requirements.
- 5. Maintain accurate records, monitor progress, and evaluate the impact of all interventions.

- 6. Participate in regular supervision, team meetings, staff development days, and internal training.
- 7. Promote collaborative, multi-agency working with statutory and third-sector partners to achieve the best outcomes for children and families.
- 8. Actively contribute to the development and promotion of Circle's services.
- 9. Adhere to Circle's policies, procedures, and professional standards at all times.
