Dot & Co's Creating a Wooden Sign Design Document

Business Purpose	Dot & Co has seen an increase in customers without prior experience in creating wooden signs with vinyl stencils. Dot & Co values small class sizes of 4-6 customers per instructor to provide a more hands-on approach. With the increase in customers who require training, more instructors would be required per class to provide hands-on support and Dot & Co is not prepared to hire additional employees at this time. This training will educate customers without prior experience creating a painted wooden sign on the step-by-step process, how to choose contrasting colors and how to assemble their finished project.
	Goal: Dot & Co will be able to serve a larger group of customers per class (7-10 customers) with only one instructor in at least 85% of classes.
Target Audience	New customers who have never painted a wooden sign before.
Training Time	30 minutes
Training Recommendation	This course will be an eLearning module. This is the best format because the module can be self-paced and completed in its entirety at the beginning of their first class. While the module is being completed by new customers who have never painted a wooden sign, the instructor will begin class for the returning, experienced painters and support them with their needs. The instructor is responsible for checking in with customers taking the module to see if they need support after getting the returning customers started. As customers complete the module, they will join the class and the instructor will be able to focus on providing them with tailored individual or small group support. The learning will largely be scenario based with a knowledge check. It begins with an instructor welcoming the customer into the store, introducing them to contrasting colors, explaining the step-by-step

Assessment Plan	This assessment will measure the learning objectives of the course.
