#### **Investment Objective**

The Excelsia Balanced 27four Fund aims to generate long-term growth of capital and income by investing in a diversified combination of domestic and international assets while adhering to the regulations that apply to retirement funds.

#### **Investment summary**

The Fund will seek to capture value through investing in a broad range of asset classes in a balanced manner. The Fund will invest in a diversified range of equities, preference shares, bonds, debentures, fixed income, instruments based on the value of any precious metal and property markets. Asset allocation will be managed actively, and the Fund will seek to capture value opportunities by switching between asset classes and also focus on equity selection opportunities. The Fund is permitted to invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments in line with the conditions as determined by legislation from time to time. The Fund will invest in South African and offshore markets subject to the investment conditions determined by legislation from time to time.

#### Analysis of the Fund and information on adherence/non-adherence with investment objective

The Fund is meeting its policy objectives. The Fund has delivered a positive return since inception and has outperformed the benchmark.

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Collective Investment Schemes in Securities (CIS) should be considered as medium to long-term investments. CIS prices are calculated on a net asset basis, which is the total value of all the assets in the portfolio including any income accruals and less any permissible deductions (brokerage, STT, VAT, auditor's fees, bank charges, trustee and custodian fees and the annual management fee) from the portfolio divided by the number of participatory interests (units) in issue, Forward pricing is used. The Fund's Total Expense Ratio (TER) reflects the percentage of the average Net Asset Value (NAV) of the portfolio that was incurred as charges, levies and fees related to the management of the portfolio. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TER's. Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

### **Risk Guidance:**

#### Low:

Generally low risk portfolios have minimal equity exposure or equity exposure, resulting in far less volatility than more aggressive mandated portfolio and in turn the probability of capital loss (permanent/temporary) is less likely. However, expected potential long term investment returns could be lower over the medium to long term

These portfolios generally hold more equity exposure than low risk portfolios but less than high risk portfolios. In turn the expected volatility is higher than low risk portfolios but less that high risk portfolios. The probability of losses are higher than low risk portfolios, but less than high risk portfolios. Expected potential long term investment returns could therefore be lower than high risk portfolios due to lower equity exposure, but higher than low risk portfolios.

# High:

Generally these portfolios hold more equity exposure than any other risk profiled portfolios, therefore these portfolios tend to carry more volatility. Expected potential long term returns could be higher than other risk profiles, in turn potential losses of capital could be higher.

# **Fund Specific Risks:**

- Equity investment risk: Value of equities (e.g. shares) and equity-related investments may vary according to company profits and future prospects as well as more general market factors.
