Objectives and Investment Policy


The Fund's objective is to maximise capital growth by investing directly or indirectly in equities and equity-related securities.


The Fund aims to achieve its objective by investing in global equity and equity-related securities. The Fund will gain exposure primarily through direct investment in these securities but may also invest indirectly in such securities by investing (up to 10% of its net assets) in collective investment schemes.

The Fund may invest up to 100% of its Net Asset Value in equities and equity-related securities comprising common stock, preference and convertible preference shares, as well as depository receipts for such securities, which equities and equity-related securities will be listed or traded on Recognised Exchanges worldwide.

In selecting investments for the Fund, the Investment Manager seeks to understand a company's underlying business and to determine the intrinsic value of the company, with a view to identifying favourable investment opportunities and generating positive long-term returns for investors. As part of this process, the Investment Manager considers the strength of a company's financial position by analysing its balance sheet, income statement, revenues and margins, profit / earning ratios and free cashflow yield over an extended period. The Investment Manager seeks to identify investment opportunities in circumstances where companies may be going through a period of poor performance but where the business and/or industry cycle may be turning, or where a business may experience new growth opportunities. The Investment Manager takes a long-term approach to investing, with a typical investment horizon of three to five years. Outperformance in the long term is driven by focusing on the long-term intrinsic value of a business instead of analysing short-term performance which can be driven primarily by market sentiment and news flow rather than the underlying intrinsic value of the business

The Fund may invest up to 20% of its net assets in cash or ancillary liquid assets comprising short-term money market instruments, including, but not limited to, non-bespoke fixed or floating rate notes and fixed or variable rate commercial paper (such as fixed and floating rate bonds), which will be listed on a Recognised Exchange, and cash equivalents such as certificates of deposit and cash deposits denominated in such currency or currencies as the Investment





The risk indicator is determined using historical data or, where historical data is not available, using simulated historical data. • Equity Investment - Value of equities (e.g. shares) and equityrelated investments may vary according to company profits and future prospects as well as more general market factors. In the Manager shall determine. Any debt securities held as ancillary liquid assets may be corporate or government issued and will have a credit rating or an implied credit rating of "investment grade" at the time of investment.

The Fund may hedge currency exposure arising from security positions held by the Fund. The Fund may be exposed to all currencies (both OECD and non-OECD, including emerging markets), through both purchases and sales of securities.

Investments will have a global focus insofar as investments are not confined or concentrated in any particular geographic region or market. The Fund may have exposure of up to 50% of its Net Asset Value to emerging markets.

The Fund's performance is measured against the MSCI ACWI Gross Total Return USD Index (the "Benchmark"). The Benchmark is designed to represent performance of the full opportunity set of largeand mid-cap stocks across 23 developed and 24 emerging markets, and covers approximately 85% of the free float-adjusted market capitalization of the global investable equity opportunity set.

The Fund is actively managed in reference to, and seeks to achieve outperformance of, the Benchmark. Whilst the Benchmark is used as an initial indicative universe from which to select stocks and is utilised to monitor certain risk indicators, the Investment Manager has broad discretion with respect to individual stock selection and may invest in securities that are not included in the Benchmark.

Any income arising from the Fund will be reinvested and it is not intended that the Fund will pay dividends.

You may buy and sell shares in the Fund on each Business Day in Ireland.
