


General Long-Term Trends

The Raw Materials supplies accounted for 58% of U.S total imports from African countries in 2023...



In 2023, raw materials accounted for a significant 58% of the total U.S. imports from African nations, representing over \$23 billion out of a total \$39.5 billion in exports. This marks a slight decline from 2017, when raw materials represented 62% of the total export value, amounting to \$21 billion out of \$34 billion. This shift indicates a gradual diversification in trade, with a growing focus on other sectors.

Between 2017 and 2023, the Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of exports from African countries to the USA was a moderate +2.09%, with total exports increasing from approximately \$34.2 billion in 2017 to a projected \$40 billion in 2024. While raw materials still form a large portion of exports, significant growth has been observed in the trade of agricultural products, as well as value-added goods such as vehicles, appliances, and clothing. For many of these categories, the CAGR has surpassed 10-20% annually, reflecting Africa's expanding role in a more diversified global trade landscape.




Agriculture has emerged as **one of the fastest-growing export categories** from African countries to the U.S. In 2017, agricultural exports totaled approximately \$0.7 billion and by 2023, this figure had surged to over \$1.7 billion, while in the first nine months of 2024, the exports had already approached \$1.8 billion. With projections for full-year 2024 reaching \$2.3 billion, we are witnessing a near threefold increase in agricultural exports over the past seven years. Among the various agricultural exports, **olive oil has experienced the most notable growth**, with exports more than doubling during this period



In the market for **strawberries**, **Egypt has emerged as a significant player**, becoming one of the United States' top suppliers. Over the past twelve months, Egypt has demonstrated impressive growth, with U.S. imports of Egyptian strawberries surpassing \$10 million.





Zimbabwe has made significant strides in expanding **its tobacco exports to the U.S.**, doubling its supply over the last twelve months. As a result, Zimbabwe's share of the U.S. tobacco import market has risen to 7.7%, up from 6% previously.



US Total Imports of Mandarins, M\$





Mandarins: South Africa and Morocco are among the key suppliers of mandarins to the U.S., jointly holding a 27% share of the imported mandarin market. In 2024, the U.S. market saw healthy growth, with imports rising by 19% and prices increasing by 4.3%. Morocco, in particular, experienced a strong performance, boosting its supply by 25%, which led to an increase in its market share from 16% in 2023 to 19% in 2024. In contrast, South Africa saw a decline in its supply of mandarins, signaling a shift in market dynamics. This presents an opportunity for Moroccan suppliers to further capitalize on growing U.S. demand for mandarins.

Dried grapes: South Africa continues to dominate the U.S. market for dried grapes, holding over 50% of total imports. In 2024, South Africa further expanded its market share, reaching 55%. The U.S. market for dried grapes is growing rapidly, with a 25% increase in imports and prices rising by 15%.



Motor vehicles, parts and equipment


In 2017, exports of the items listed below were valued at approximately \$1.25 billion. By 2023, this figure had more than doubled, reaching \$2.5 billion, reflecting an impressive 100% growth. Looking ahead to 2024, expected exports are projected to surpass \$3.1 billion, continuing the robust upward trajectory

Motor vehicles, parts



Exports of **cars with engine capacities ranging from 1,500 to 3,000 cc** are poised to reach \$2.3 billion in 2024. **South Africa** has made notable strides in this sector, increasing its car exports to the U.S. by 30% over the last twelve months.



Apparel: Steady Growth in African Clothing Exports

African suppliers have steadily increased their exports of various types of clothing to the U.S. Total imports of these items grew from \$0.57 billion in 2017 to \$1.13 billion in 2023, reflecting a strong upward trend. For 2024, full-year exports are expected to exceed \$1.2 billion, further solidifying the region's growing presence in the U.S. apparel market.








US Total Imports of Women's trousers & shorts, of cotton, knitted, B\$




US Total Imports of Men's trousers & shorts, of cotton, knitted, B\$

Natural Resources & Raw Materials

Exports of natural resources and raw materials from African countries to the U.S. totaled \$3.2 billion in 2023. Projections for 2024 indicate a substantial increase, with exports expected to exceed \$10 billion.






US Total Imports of Portland cement (other than white), B\$




US Largest Suppliers, (M\$) Dec 2023 – Nov 2024




US Suppliers with Highest Growth (M\$) Dec 2023 – Nov 2024

Conclusions

Continued Dominance of Natural Resources in African Exports to the U.S.

Natural resources continue to dominate exports from Africa to the U.S., with this category showing the fastest growth across all product groups. Exports of raw materials are projected to reach \$10 billion in 2024, up from \$3 billion in 2017, reflecting a dramatic increase. This growth far outpaces that of other sectors, reinforcing the strategic importance of these commodities in the global trade landscape.

"Non-raw materials" exports from Africa to the U.S. face stiff competition from Latin American and Asian countries, particularly in sectors such as food, clothing, and consumer goods. When comparing the U.S. and EU markets, the European market appears to offer greater potential for African suppliers, particularly in non-raw materials sectors, where demand is growing in diverse industries.

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
