

Yams refer to a specific type of batata ("sweet potato") derived from various species within the Dioscorea genus, including Dioscorea alata (white yama), Dioscorea bulbifera (potato yama), Dioscorea cayenensis (yellow yama), Dioscorea esculenta (Asian yama), and Dioscorea batatas (Chinese yama). These are classified under HS Code 071430, which is the focus of the analysis in this report. Additionally, there is a separate category for "sweet potatoes" under HS Code 071420, which is not included in the scope of this study

Yams Imports from African countries in 2023 – 2024

In 2023 -2024, **African countries** have supplied yams to Top-3 largest importers: **USA** (51.4% of global yams imports), **Canada** (15.0% of global yams imports) and the **United Kingdom** (6.7% of global yams imports).





Conclusions

- The yams market remains a niche segment, with total global imports valued at \$230 million, offering a competitive advantage to exporters. Notably, the leading importing countries— the United States (51%), Canada (15%), and the United Kingdom (7%)— are primarily English-speaking.
- There is a **significant disparity in yams consumption across developed countries**. For instance, Italy's consumption of yams is six times lower than that of the United Kingdom. This difference presents an opportunity for exporters and exporting countries to expand their market reach, particularly if exports are supported by active and systematic promotion of yams as a new product in target markets.
- As yams have gained popularity in developed countries such as the USA, Canada, the United Kingdom, and France, there is significant
 potential for similar success in other developed nations, including Germany, Belgium, and Spain. With the right strategies, there are
 strong opportunities to boost yams sales and global trade, especially if supported by targeted marketing and promotional efforts in these
 markets.
- Considering the African supplying countries, Ghana is the dominant supplier to the largest global markets. In 2024, Ghana accounted for 88.8% of the United Kingdom's yams imports, 19.5% of the United States' imports, and 16.5% of Canada's imports. This highlights Ghana's significant role in meeting the demand for yams in these key markets.
- Notably, yams compete with other types of batata, such as sweet potatoes. According to data from the UK, sweet potatoes are often sold alongside yams, with yams accounting for approximately 12% of the total sweet potato imports. Additionally, the sales of sweet potatoes have been increasing recently, highlighting a growing demand for both products in these markets.
