MINNEAPOLIS - The Golden Gophers return to Big Ten Conference play with a weekend men's hockey series at Notre Dame Nov. 22-23. Puck drop is scheduled for 6 p.m. (CT) Friday night and finishes Saturday at 5 p.m. (CT).

Fans can watch both games streaming live on Peacock or tune into the Gopher Radio Network 103.5 FM/AM-1130 KTLK to listen as Wally Shaver and Pat Micheletti call the action.

LAST TIME OUT

Minnesota picked up its ninth-straight victory on Thursday in a 5-3 home win over Bemidji State thanks to a pair of goals from Brody Lamb and the eventual game winner from John Mittelstadt. The streak ended two days later on the road as the Beavers earned a series split behind a defensive effort that limited the Gophers to one goal on 39 shots during a 3-1 setback. Oliver Moore ended a six-game point drought with a team-best three points as he reached the scoresheet in both outings, while Matthew Wood's Saturday goal was his first tally since Oct. 25.

WATCH THE PRIDE ON ICE

Minnesota and FOX9 have partnered for a local television broadcast deal for the second-straight year that will air 16 home games and four road games during the 2024-25 campaign presented by Affinity Plus Federal Credit Union. This year's home broadcasts on FOX9 and FOX9+ will feature a 30-minute Pride on Ice Pre-Game Show presented by M Health Fairview as well as a post-game show recapping the action presented by RBC Wealth Management. This is in addition to the six games picked by the Big Ten Network and one airing on FS1 during the year. Check the schedule page on GopherSports.com for all the latest information and viewing options for every contest. Other FOX affiliates around the area have added Gopher hockey to their coverage with games available in Duluth (KQDS) and Fargo (KVRN) markets.

SUITCASE LIVING

The Gophers are closing a stretch where five of six games are away from home with trips to Madison, Wis., and South Bend, Ind., surrounding a home-and-home series with Bemidji State. Minnesota holds a 4-1-0 record in true road games this season and while there is little difference in the scoring offense between home and road, 4.00 to 3.80 goals per game, respectively, there is a stark change defensively as it allows more than a goal per game more when away from campus, 1.25 to 2.60. One area the Gophers have thrived when on the road is the power play as they are converting 33.3 percent (5-for-15) compared to just 14.3 percent (2-for-14) at 3M Arena at Mariucci.

JOHNSON REACHES NHL MILESTONE

Former Gophers' defenseman Erik Johnson skated in the 1,000th game of his National Hockey League career last Saturday as his Philadelphia Flyers defeated the Buffalo Sabres at Wells Fargo Center. The first-overall pick of the 2006 NHL Entry Draft by the St. Louis Blues, Johnson has spent 17 seasons in the NHL playing for four teams, totaling 94 goals and 251 assists for 345 career points. A native of Bloomington, Minn., he was the fifth American-born player to be selected first in the NHL draft and remains the highest draft pick in team history. He is the ninth former skater from Minnesota, and fourth player from the 2006-07 team, to reach the 1,000-game milestone, the most of any NCAA program. In his lone season with the Maroon and Gold, he led all WCHA rookie defenseman in scoring with 28 points on four goals and 24 assists, earning a WCHA All-Rookie Team selection.

TIME TO START A NEW STREAK

Minnesota saw its winning streak stop Saturday after nine-consecutive victories and looks to begin a new streak with four series remaining before the holiday break, including three at home. It was the third time

the Gophers had won nine or more games in a row since the start of the 2020-21 campaign. During the recent stretch, the Maroon and Gold were dominating in all facets of the game and outscored its opponents by a 40-17 margin thanks to a 10-3 advantage in power-play goals. Jimmy Snuggerud led the charge as he totaled 14 points and had a point in eight of the nine outings, while four other skaters reached double-digit points in that span. The goaltending tandem of Nathan Airey and Liam Souliere limited the opposition to a combined 1.88 goals-against average and a .926 save percentage.

SHOWING OFF THE BALANCE

The Gophers have picked up 49 goals this season from 15 different players and 134 points via 21 skaters, with three added to that list following last Thursday's win over Bemidji State. Minnesota's offensive depth in 2024-25 has shined through seven players reaching double-digit scoring as the team ranks second nationally in scoring offense, averaging 4.1 goals per game. The team has lit the lamp five or more times in six appearances and been held to fewer than three goals three times. More importantly, the Gophers are putting in the work on the defensive end, holding the NCAA's second-best scoring margin at plus-2.2 as they have surrendered 23 goals all season, a 1.9 goals per game average.

SNUGGERUD STARS AGAIN

For the fifth time in his career, Jimmy Snuggerud was named a B1G Star of the Week (Nov. 12), this time after leading the Gophers with multiple points in each game of a road sweep at Wisconsin. He scored twice in the come-from-behind win Friday, including the game winner in the third period, before adding two assists Saturday. He capped the weekend with a backhand saucer pass to Brodie Ziemer for the overtime winner, which was the 50th assist of his career. After another two-assist game versus Bemidji State (Nov. 14), Snuggerud put up multi-point efforts five times in a seven-game stretch and is tied for the team's scoring lead with 15 points. He has 28 career multi-point games and is just one point shy of 100 as a Gopher, thanks to reaching the scoresheet in nine of 12 appearances this year. He posted 21 goals in each of his first two college hockey seasons and is one of just six Gophers to score 20 or more goals in back-to-back seasons since 2000.

STRONG SOPHOMORE START

Goaltender Nathan Airey is fully healthy entering his second year of college hockey after missing nearly the entire first half of last season with an injury and is making an impact in the Minnesota net. He earned his first win during his college hockey debut last January at home against Robert Morris (Jan. 12) and has won all six of his starts to begin his sophomore campaign. A native of Cochrane, Alberta, Airey is one of only two NCAA goaltenders (with at least six appearances) to have won every start this season. He owns a 2.17 goals-against average and a .908 save percentage in 2024-25 and given up two or fewer goals in four of six outings.

SOULIERE STOPPED THEM ALL

Graduate transfer goaltender Liam Souliere is enjoying a change of scenery as he joined the Gophers during the summer after playing four seasons at B1G-foe Penn State. After suffering a 2-1 overtime loss in his Minnesota debut against Omaha (Oct. 12), he won four-straight starts, including a 28-save shutout of the Nittany Lions

(Nov. 2) in his first appearance versus his former team. That was also his first time playing in front of his new home fans inside 3M Arena at Mariucci. He has allowed nine goals in six appearances this season, no more than two in any game, for a 1.49 goals-against average and a .940 save percentage, both of which rank in the top eight nationally. Souliere has needed to be at his best as the Gophers are averaging just 2.8 goals per game when the Montreal, Quebec, native has started between the pipes. Before joining the Maroon and Gold, he ranked second all-time in wins (39), third in saves (2,067) and shutouts (3), fifth in goals-against average (2.95), and seventh in save percentage (.897) with PSU.

LAMB STARS THE POWER PLAY

Brody Lamb continues to find offensive success after setting career highs in goals (12), assists (15), and points (27) a year ago. The Byron, Minn., native has a point in nine of 12 outings this season and registered a career-long, five-game point streak between Oct. 18 and Nov. 1. Thanks to a four-goal weekend against St. Thomas, including his first NCAA hat trick, Lamb was named the B1G Second Star of the Week (Oct. 29). All three goals of his natural hat trick Saturday were on the power play and he has scored six of the Gophers' 10 goals on the man advantage this year, ranking second in the NCAA, while his eight total goals sits tied for third.

CAPTAIN CHESLEY DOUBLES DOWN

It took a matter of just six games to start the 2024-25 campaign for junior Ryan Chesley to double his career goal output. The captain has now scored five times this year, tied for the most of any defenseman in the nation, after recording two goals in each of his first two college seasons. A native of Mahtomedi, Minn., he scored twice on opening night versus Air Force (Oct. 11) before getting the game-tying goal in the first period against St. Thomas during back-to-back outings. Chesley tacked on the first shorthanded goal of his career at Wisconsin (Nov. 8), and reached double figures for the second time in his tenure with his 10th point via an assist at Bemidji State (Nov. 16), matching his single-season career best.

KURTH STARS IN SEASON OPENER

Connor Kurth was named the B1G Second Star of the Week (Oct. 15) thanks to his career-best, four-point outing in the Gophers' season opener against Air Force in Las Vegas. The forward scored a goal in all three periods versus the Falcons and remains one of four players from the Big Ten Conference with a four-point outing this year. He matched his single-season career high of seven goals with his first collegiate power-play tally at Wisconsin, tying for 10th in the NCAA in total goals. The nation's plus-minus leader at plus-13, Kurth tied his career-long, goal-scoring streak when he found the back of the net for the third-consecutive outing at Xcel Energy Center against St. Thomas (Oct. 26).

CLARK CATCHING ON

For the first time in his career, Jimmy Clark was named a B1G Star of the Week (Oct. 22) after leading the Gophers with five points during the road sweep at Minnesota Duluth, earning Second Star honors. He recorded the first three-point effort of his career in the series opener, all three points coming via assists in the first period. The Edina, Minn., native went on to score his first power-play goal with the Maroon and Gold the next night. He followed that by scoring in consecutive outings for

the first time as a Gopher when he buried the final goal in both games of a B1G sweep of No. 18 Penn State, including the game winner in a 1-0 shutout with just 26 seconds remaining in regulation during the series finale (Nov. 2). It was Clark's second-career game-winning goal, and with points in back-to-back games, set a new career high for points in a season with his 12th following an assist versus Bemidji State (Nov. 14).

HISTORY WITH THE FIGHTING IRISH

Minnesota owns a 44-28-6 (.603) record all-time against Notre Dame, dating back to 1925, including a 10-3-1 mark over the past 14 outings but have split each of the last two series. The Gophers have won six of the last seven series finales with the Irish. Under the guidance of Coach Motzko, the Maroon and Gold are 8-3-2 inside Compton Family Ice Arena and hold an all-time record of 15-11-3 in games played at Notre Dame.

INSIDE LOOK AT NOTRE DAME

The Fighting Irish were swept by league-leading Michigan State last weekend and were outscored by a 12-6 margin. The setbacks extended their losing streak to five games after opening league play with an overtime win over Wisconsin back on Nov. 1. Notre Dame leads the B1G with 132 total penalty minutes, the ninth-most in the NCAA, while its penalty kill ranks 32nd nationally at 81.1 percent efficiency. Cole Knuble and Justin Janicke pace the team with 13 and 11 points, respectively, while Knuble has scored three of the team's five game-winning goals, sitting third in the country in that category. Goaltender Owen Say has started five of the last six games for the Irish and has a 2.42 goals-against average and a .934 save percentage for a 4-4-0 record this season.

WOODY, YOUR FAVORITE DEPUTY

No stranger to putting up points in college hockey, junior transfer Matthew Wood has kept that trend going since donning the Minnesota uniform. He burst onto the scene opening night behind a three-assist effort versus Air Force (Oct. 11) and registered five multi-point performances in his first six appearances. The product of Nanaimo, B.C., scored his first goal at Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 18), starting a three-game, goal-scoring streak. Wood is tied for the team scoring lead with 15 points, which sits seventh in the country, while his 11 assists are

fourth among all NCAA skaters.

NEW NUMBER, SAME SAM THE STAR

While he may have changed from No. 5 to No. 2 during the offseason, the game of Sam Rinzel has remained unchanged following an All-B1G Second Team selection in 2023-24. After recording multi-point performances in both games against St. Thomas, the sophomore landed B1G First Star of the Week honors (Oct. 29). He extended his career-long point streak to eight games, dating back to the final game of last season, with an assist in the series opener versus Penn State (Nov. 1) and had a point in eight of his first nine appearances this year. Rinzel's four goals are tied for third in the country among NCAA defensemen, one behind teammate Ryan Chesley for the national lead, while his 10 points rank eighth.

MITTELSTADT SERVES UP WINNERS

After Luke Mittelstadt failed to pick up a point for the first five games this season, he has an assist in three of his last seven appearances. All three of those helpers have come on the winning goal of game two in the series that sealed a Minnesota sweep. The Eden Prairie, Minn., product became the first Gophers' defenseman to record 20-plus points in each of his first two seasons since Alex Goligoski had 20 in 2004-05 and 39 in 2005-06. His consistent effort earned him a spot on the All-B1G Honorable Mention Team as a sophomore. Meanwhile, his brother John scored his first goal of the season and second-career game-winning goal in a home win over Bemidji State (Nov. 14) that snapped a goal drought of 26 games.

ZIERER ENJOYING LIFE ON THE ROAD

Brodie Ziemer scored a highlight-reel goal in overtime that helped the Gophers to a come-from-behind win at Wisconsin (Nov. 9). It was the first game-winning goal of his short career and a night where he put up multiple points for the first time with the Gophers. The freshman found his rhythm when Minnesota was away from home as he sits tied for third on the team in road scoring. Five of his six points this year have come on the road, and he has a point in all but one true road outing, including a goal in three of the five contests. Ziemer ranks third among B1G rookies in goals and sixth in total scoring in 2024-25.

SHOWING OFF SPECIAL TEAMS

Minnesota's 10 goals on the man advantage lead the B1G and rank eighth in the NCAA as it has converted at least one power play in seven of its last 10 outings. The Gophers have a pair of multi-goal efforts coming versus St. Thomas (Oct. 26) and Wisconsin (Nov. 9). The Maroon and Gold have allowed only two goals by its opposition over the past nine games, erasing 18 of the last 20 power-play chances in that span. Last season, the team surrendered just 18 power-play goals against, the third-fewest in program history and are averaging 0.42 power-play goals allowed over the past four seasons.

STARTING IN SECOND

Following its back-to-back Big Ten Conference regular season titles in 2021-22 and 2022-23, Minnesota finished in third place in the league standings a year ago. With a league-leading six B1G titles already under their belt, the Gophers are looking to get back to the top of the conference this season and were picked to place second in the preseason poll as voted upon by the B1G's seven head coaches. Defending champion Michigan State holds the top honor after claiming its first-ever regular season and tournament titles last season.

B1G PRESEASON HONORS TO FOUR

Four players representing the Maroon and Gold were recognized by the league's head coaches and named to one of the Preseason All-B1G Teams for 2024-25. Jimmy Snuggerud was a unanimous selection to the All-B1G First Team where he was joined by Sam Rinzel. Mike Koster and newcomer Matthew Wood earned spots on the All-B1G Second Team.

DRAFTED THE SWEET 16

The Gophers have more NHL draft picks on their roster than any other NCAA hockey program in 2024-25. Minnesota's 16 players are the most for the team since 2011-12 when it had 17. From that roster more than a decade ago, four players (Nick Bjuggstad, Travis Boyd, Erik Haula, Justin Holl) are still playing in the NHL. This year's roster features four first-round selections in Matthew Wood (15th overall), Oliver Moore (19th overall), Jimmy Snuggerud (23rd overall), and Sam Rinzel (25th overall). Minnesota has had the most all-time draft selections (242) by any NCAA men's hockey program after adding three over the summer. At least one Gopher has been drafted in 50 of the last 51 NHL Entry Drafts dating back to 1974, with 2001 being the only exception.

SEEKING THE NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

Minnesota's win over Omaha in the 2024 NCAA Sioux Falls Regional opener last season was the program's 62nd all-time victory in the NCAA Tournament, the most of any college hockey program. The Gophers own a 62-42 record (.596) in 41 trips to the national stage since 1953 and have made four-consecutive appearances. Under the guidance of head coach Bob Motzko, the Maroon and Gold own a mark of 7-4 in the postseason event, including at least one win in each of the last four years.

BACK FOR YEAR FIVE

Mainstays in the Gophers' lineup over the past four years, Mike Koster and Mason Nevers are back on campus and healthy as team captains for their fifth and final seasons in 2024-25. Entering the year with the most active games played by any NCAA defenseman, Koster has taken the ice 152 times and again is anchoring the team's defensive corps. The Chaska, Minn., product finished last year recording two goals and 12 assists for 14 total points, despite

missing the entire first month due to an injury. Nevers has skated in 150 career games, totaling 60 points on 22 goals and 38 assists. A native of Edina, Minn., he posted a career-best, plus-16 rating to go with his third-consecutive campaign reaching double-digit scoring after returning to the lineup following an early-season injury.

BOLSTERED THE BLUE LINE

Minnesota returns seven defensemen to the lineup, including four with more than 75 games of college hockey experience, as the backbone of the roster. The team welcomed two freshmen over the summer as Leo Gruba and John Whipple will bolster the blue line, giving the team depth at every turn. Gruba was named the USHL Defenseman of the Year after helping the Fargo Force win the Clark Cup last season. He led all USHL defensemen in scoring with 57 points in 60 games, setting a single-season franchise record for points by a blue liner. Whipple comes to campus as a 2024 fifth-round draft pick of the Detroit Red Wings following a 17-point campaign with the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

DEFENSEMAN 'U'

Minnesota was the lone college hockey program in the country with double-digit blue liners in the NHL last year. A total of 12 former Gopher defensemen took the ice in the NHL during the 2023-24 season, accounting for more than 750 games played. Highlighting the group was Brock Faber as he finished second in voting for the Calder Trophy given to the NHL's rookie of the year. Nick Leddy and Erik Johnson both reached the 1,000-game milestone, becoming the eighth and ninth former Gopher to hit the mark.

COMFORTS OF HOME

Only once in the 31-year history of 3M Arena at Mariucci has Minnesota not posted a winning record inside its home building and that happened in 2010-11 when the team was 9-10-3. Since that year, the Gophers own a 177-69-16 record (.706) and have won double-digit home games each of the last 13 years. That includes a mark of 14-6-1 from last season, aided by the Maroon and Gold winning eight-straight games from Jan. 8 and Mar. 1, the longest home win streak since 2017. Under Coach Motzko's guidance, the Gophers hold an 80-39-6 (.664) record on home ice, including a 47-17-1 (.727) mark across the previous four years. That stretch of quality play is aided by Minnesota dominating Big Ten foes, going 30-10-1 (.744) in conference outings inside 3M Arena at Mariucci since the start of 2021.

STAYING DISCIPLINED

A strength over the last six years for Minnesota has been playing a disciplined brand of hockey and avoiding trips to the penalty box. The Gophers ended the 2023-24 season as the nation's leader in penalty minutes, averaging just 6.6 per game, and currently rank fourth at 5.9 a night through 12 games. Three times over the last five seasons, the Maroon and Gold have finished a campaign as the NCAA's least penalized team, and they have ended inside the top five every year since 2018-19. Under Coach Motzko's direction, the team has never averaged double-digit penalty minutes per game for an entire season with the highest of 9.8 minutes in his first year behind the Gophers' bench.

HITTING THE 20-WIN MARK

After winning 23 games in 2023-24, the Gophers secured their fourth-consecutive season with at least 20 wins and the 10th time over the past

13 campaigns and are halfway to reaching that mark this year, sitting at 10 wins in 12 outings. The sustained success of the Gophers has been a point of emphasis as the program has reached the 20-win mark 41 times in 51 years dating back to 1973-74, a year when the Maroon and Gold claimed the first of its five national championships.

WE ARE THE STATE OF HOCKEY

According to data from College Hockey Inc., 249 NCAA Division I men's hockey players hail from the state of Minnesota, nearly a quarter of all student-athletes, and more than double the next closest state. That total is bolstered by the Gophers lineup as 22 of their players this season will skate in their home state, including five of their eight newcomers. Even more impressive is the fact that 20 of the 22 Minnesotans on the team are from within 70 miles of campus.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Minnesota's lineup has a more international flavor than years past as the team has four players from outside the country in 2024-25. The last time that many international players were on the Gophers' roster in a single season was 1951-52. Two of the team's goaltenders are from Canada in Nathan Airey (Cochrane, Alberta) and Liam Souliere (Montréal, Québec), while fellow Canadian Matthew Wood joins the group as a native of Nanaimo, British Columbia. For the first time since 2018, a Swedish-born player will don the Maroon and Gold as Erik Pålsson begins his collegiate career. Leon Bristedt was the most recent Swedish skater for the Gophers, as he played 144 games between 2014-18.

GROUP OF LEADERS

For the first time in program history, a total of six players are part of the Gophers' official leadership group. Ryan Chesley, Mike Koster, Mason Nevers, and Jimmy Snuggerud will each have a 'C' added to their sweaters in 2024-25, while Aaron Huglen and Cal Thomas were chosen to wear an 'A'. In the history of Minnesota hockey, 173 different players have served in a captain's role.

SEVEN-YEAR AGE GAP

When the puck drops for its season opener on Oct. 11, the average age of each player on the Minnesota roster will be 21 years and 137 days old (21.38 years), making it the fifth-youngest roster in the nation, per stats from College Hockey Inc. Nick Michel and Liam Souliere are the lone players born before 2000 and share a March birthday. Born a month apart in 2006, John Whipple and Brodie Ziemer represent the Maroon and Gold as the youngest skaters.

LUCKY SEVEN FOR COACH MOTZKO

The 2023 Spencer Penrose Coach of the Year award winner, Minnesota head coach Bob Motzko currently owns a 146-73-17 record after leading the Gophers to four-straight, 20-plus-win campaigns. In five of the six seasons with Coach Motzko at the helm, the program has been ranked in the top five of the national polls at some point. He is the seventh coach in program history to reach the 100-win milestone and has earned the title of BIG Coach of the Year three times in the last five seasons.

COUNT THAT HIGH

In a unique twist this season, a player will wear the No. 72, No. 74, and No. 91 sweaters for the first time in the program's more than 100-year history. Freshmen Erik Pålsson and Brodie Ziemer will don the No. 72 and 74 uniforms, respectively, while transfer Matthew Wood chose the No. 91 for the Gophers. Fellow newcomer Leo Gruba is set to be just the third to ever wear No. 55, following Matt Staudacher and John Amatuzio.

FAMILY TIES TO THE 'M'

Minnesota men's hockey remains deep-rooted in family history as four current members of the team have a relative that also wore the Maroon and Gold in some fashion. Jimmy Snuggerud is a third-generation Gopher joining his father, Dave, an All-American in 1989, and maternal grandfather, James Westby. The three have combined to score 135 goals in a Minnesota uniform. Brothers John and Luke Mittelstadt followed in the footsteps of their older brother, Casey, in attending Minnesota after the eldest was on campus for one season in 2017-18. The three Mittelstadt brothers have combined for 78 points in 174 career appearances. Freshman Beckett Hendrickson's father, Darby, and uncle, Dan, recorded 124 Gopher points as they each wore the 'M' sweater for at least two seasons. Newcomer Matthew Wood also has a connection to the Maroon and Gold as his father, Jamie, was an assistant coach for the Gopher women's hockey team from 2008-10 under head coach Brad Frost.

FROM 'U' TO THE LEAGUE

Thirty-one former Gophers took part in National Hockey League training camps for the 2024-25 season, representing 21 different NHL organizations. Included in the group that spans more than 15 years of the program are 13 former captains and nine All-Americans. Minnesota had 26 former skaters in the NHL last season, increasing the all-time number of Gophers in the NHL to an NCAA-best 125. Brock Faber finished second in the 2024 Calder Memorial Trophy voting, the highest ever for a Gopher, while Logan Cooley was fifth, and both guys were named to the NHL's All-Rookie Team in 2023-24. In the final game of the season, Kyle Okposo joined Ben Clymer and Jordan Leopold as the only former Gophers to play in Game 7 of a Stanley Cup Final. Clymer's Tampa Bay Lightning defeated Leopold's Calgary Flames back in 2004. Okposo also made it three-straight seasons with a Gopher hoisting the Stanley Cup after his Florida Panthers won in June, a feat that had never been done in program history.

VIA THE NATIONAL TEAM

The Gophers' roster in 2024-25 is full of national team experience as six former USA Hockey National Team Development Program alumni are on the roster, bringing the total from the USNTDP that have suited up for Minnesota to 39. Eighteen of the 33 previous Gophers from the national team have gone on to skate in the NHL.

SIGHTS SET ON ST. LOUIS

The end goal of the 2024-25 campaign is to be skating on the ice of the Enterprise Center in St. Louis, Mo., the host site of the NCAA Frozen Four, set for April 10 and 12. Minnesota has reached the Frozen Four 23 times in program history, the fourth-most of any team, including two trips in the past three years.

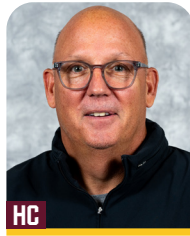
