Yes, we have a clear understanding of the current definition. Current misunderstanding will only be addressed with the use of new definitions which align with the common industry understanding of the term 'competent'.

Q12. Are there any other issues regarding the definition and requirements of competent persons for asbestos-related tasks that should be considered? Please provide information and reasons to support your response.

The AMWU see the current definition of 'competent person' as deficient. We are of a view that this deficiency is what has created the confusion. The word competent is widely used within industry, to be considered competent elsewhere requires assessment. As a result we can't support timeframe/experience alone, or an unspecified training course developed by a PCBU (to which the current definitions allow) as being able to demonstrate competence, it requires appropriate and relevant qualification. The current definitions being, "A person who has acquired through training, qualification or experience the knowledge and skills to carry out the task" & amp; "A person who has acquired through training, qualification or experience the knowledge and skills to carry out the task, and who has been trained in accordance with Regulation 445", as currently read, does not guarantee the delivery of competency (or a competent person). To avoid this problem and so as to ensure consistence across Australia we have concluded that there is a requirement to redefine 'competent person' as "A person that can demonstrate that they are technically competent to undertake an asbestos related task, through a combination of qualifications, practical experience and accreditation". With regards to Independent Competent Person & Dependent Person & De Licensed Asbestos Assessor, as well as the above concerns, we don't support the current inclusion of "tertiary qualification in occupational health and safety, occupational hygiene, science, building, construction or environmental health" without a caveat that such tertiary qualifications in those areas must be inclusive of modules specific to any asbestos related tasks the person is required to undertake. We note that it is possible to complete all of these tertiary qualification without any modules relating to asbestos.
