Emphasis on personal exploration cultivates not only skilled sculptors but also resilient, innovative artists.







Semester Overview

Class 1: Introduction to Air-Dry Clay

Criteria Accuracy Color Matching

- Learn to make ball shapes of different sizes.
- Practice rolling techniques (using hands/fingertips against the table and how much pressure to use)
- Discover methods for smoothing crevices.



Class 2: Basics of Mixing Colors

Criteria Accuracy Color Matching

- Understanding primary (Red, Blue, Yellow) and secondary colors (Purple, Green, Orange)
- Purple = Red + Blue
- Green = Yellow + Blue
- Orange = Yellow + Red





Semester Overview [Continued]

Class 3: Crafting Oval Shapes

Criteria Accuracy Color Matching Smooth Surface

- Refine rolling technique.
- Shaping ovals from spherical forms, utilizing abstraction to create irregular shapes.



Class 4: Crafting Tear Drop Shape

Criteria Accuracy Smooth Surface Regular Shapes

- Learn to make teardrops of different sizes and dimensions.
- Practice crafting technique (using hands/fingertips against the table and appropriate application of pressure)



Class 5: Crafting Cylindrical Shapes

Criteria Accuracy Smooth Surface Regular Shapes

- Ensure even thickness throughout the cylinder.
- Divide clay into equal parts.
- Combine techniques used to make Ball and Teardrop.



Class 6: Sculpting Pancake Shapes

Criteria Smooth Surface Regular Shapes Detailed

- Introduce the rolling pin.
- Achieve even thickness and roundness.



Class 7: Crafting Cube Shape

Criteria Smooth Surface Regular Shapes Detailed

- Understand 3-dimensional shapes.
- Learn the 'pinching' action for sharp edges.
- Finer control over pressure.







Semester Overview [Continued]

Class 8: Creating Leaf Texture

Criteria Smooth Surface Regular Shapes Detailed Stability

- Introduce the knife tool and other common tools (needle tool, ball-point tool, scallop tool etc.)
- Understanding of forms with other elements of design, such as color, texture and composition.



Class 9: Crafting Paw Shapes

Criteria Smooth Surface Regular Shapes Detailed Stability Creativity

- Honing proficiency with the knife tool.
- Sculpting irregular shapes and commonly encountered forms.



Class 10: Combining all techniques.

Criteria Smooth Surface Regular Shapes Detailed Stability Creativity

- Promote critical thinking and problem-solving skills in exploring unique interpretation of forms.
- Ability to create and use a variety of colors to produce different visual effects.
- Application of student's understanding of 3D forms to facillitate creativity in designing and excuting clay artworks.
