Fire Safety

Business Purpose	 Knowledge of proper hospital fire safety techniques is essential for any hospital employee. A study published by the U.S. Fire Administration found that within a two-year period, around 5,700 medical facility fires were reported. Hospital fires need to be taken seriously in order to protect everyone on site. It could be the difference between life and death. Fire safety training prepares the staff to act quickly and effectively in a stressful emergency situation. CentraCare Hospital has not had a fire within the last 5 years. This course serves as a refresher for staff and will: Train the learner how to respond in a fire emergency to ensure the safety of patients and staff.

Three images show examples of fire prevention and three show examples of fire hazards Learner has one attempt and is prompted to review based on score (1-4 must review, 5-6 can skip review or choose to review)
