The average daily number should be calculated by dividing the aggregate number of attendances on working days by the number of working days during the half year. In reckoning attendances, attendance by temporary as well as permanent employees should be counted and all employees (including apprentices) should be counted and all employees should be included whether they are employed directly or under contractors. Attendance on separate shifts (e. g. night and day shifts) should be counted separately. Days on which the factory was closed, for whatever cause, and days on which the manufacturing processes were not carried on should not be treated as working days. However, if more than 50% of workers employed (on the previous days) attend to repair maintenance or other such work on closed days, such days should be treated as working days.

‘Partial attendance for less than half a shift of working day should be neglected and attendance of half a shift or more should be treated as full ‘ attendance.
