

Kelsey Sullivan is a champion for children— fighting hard to provide much-needed quality space and care for our county's youngest population.

For 15+ years, Kelsey has pursued her dream in early childhood education. Even while she was still a student at Cal Poly, Kelsey assumed a lead role at a preschool where she worked — then took a giant leap of faith on her own. With the support of her parents, Kelsey opened the Learning Tree Preschool out of her home in Atascadero.

Six years later, as the needs grew, Kelsey found a way to expand her business from a family child care home to a center-based preschool, and rented a location in downtown Atascadero. This proved to be a tricky endeavor, as city zoning and other regulations were often at odds with state child care licensing requirements. After nine years there, with the demand for childcare continuing to increase, Kelsey decided it was time to become a building *owner* and run a preschool program that could truly reflect her vision. She found the ideal space — but the move would take nearly a year. Zoning issues created the biggest roadblock — coupled with a finite escrow timeline and hefty financing process. But Kelsey persevered. She cultivated relationships and pleaded her case along with that of families

desperate for childcare — talking to the local City Council,
Planning Commission, and the Mayor of Atascadero. It worked.

On December 1st, 2019, Learning Tree started operating out of its new 5,000 square foot facility along Traffic Way, with a capacity to serve 97 children and their families. The staff there are already collaborating with teachers across the street at San Benito Elementary, helping to forge a more seamless transition to Kindergarten. Kelsey's strongest motivation of wanting to set kids up to succeed — ultimately led to the kind of community collaboration from which we ALL can benefit.
