In her role as a Public Health Aide, Deanna provides participants in the WIC Program (Women, Infants and Children) with nutrition guidance, breastfeeding support, and health education. This not only includes pregnant, postpartum and breastfeeding women, but also parents and caregivers of children as they grow from birth to age 5. All of WIC's services, extending to food vouchers and health care referrals, are provided at no cost to eligible individuals.

Deanna's colleagues say she brings enthusiasm, kindness and creativity to her work each day. She makes every parent and child feel special— and ensures that the WIC appointment is a comforting place of support. Whether it's a classroom or an office, Deanna is innovative and thoughtful in making that space warm and inviting. A father walked into the WIC clinic with his baby one day, and Deanna said to him "I admire you for raising your baby." He responded appreciatively, "Nobody has ever said that to me." She has even used her sewing talents to make breastfeeding

scarves for dozens of moms, and has given away a number of her umbrellas to clients who came in on a rainy day.

Families in need often face many obstacles. Deanna and all the members of the WIC staff team work together to help to break down walls and give hope and encouragement to parents in need of support during a critical and intense time of life for them and their babies.

After 16 years of service with SLO County's WIC program, Deanna will retire at the end of February! So it's all the more fitting that our community can honor her contributions, and celebrate her new beginning.
