Her entire young life, Alora has demonstrated the promise of the Girl Scouts to "help people at all times." She first learned from her family the importance of supporting the less fortunate— and turned that belief straight into action. Alora, 16, volunteers at a number of local charities that focus on children, and she works to incorporate community service opportunities into the Girl Scouts' activity schedule.

One of the many places Alora devotes her time is "Mama Gina's Closet" ministry, which provides clothing and toys to underprivileged children. If someone requests a specific size that is not on hand, Alora has been known to go home, look through her own wardrobe and bag up some garments that might fit! Alora is all about helping others to feel their best—and meet their fullest potential.

Alora uses her own money and time to put together care boxes for Samaritan's Purse program, collecting donated items and arranging Easter Baskets for children in homeless shelters through ECHO (El Camino Homeless Organization). She has also been a walker (guide) in the Hoofbeats equine therapy program and is involved in many additional initiatives dedicated to children: Girl Scout summer day camp, Woods Humane Society summer camp, Botanical Garden nature camp, Monart art camp, and several different vacation bible schools. Alora even helps take care of her younger brother, who is a super smart kiddo with Asperger's Syndrome and shares a very special bond with his big sis!

Though Alora is still a teenager, the number of lives she has touched is something to behold. We can't wait to witness the rest of her journey and see what her future has in store!
