As a Board Certified Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP-BC) at Bravo Pediatrics in San Luis Obispo, Alison pulls on her 15 years of experience and foundation in holistic nursing to provide individualized care for growing children. She is passionate about taking care of the entire person, not just the disease or ailment, and she strives to guide and support parents as they navigate raising a family on the Central Coast.

Alison was born and raised in SLO County, graduating from Paso Robles High School, where she was an active member in Future Farmers of America (FFA). The organization fostered in her a love for science, anatomy and leadership that led her to pursue a degree in nursing. It was while completing her Doctorate in Nursing Practice at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV) that Alison seized the opportunity to spearhead a joint project for Bravo Pediatrics and First 5 SLO County: an evidence-based initiative to promote surveillance and screening for developmental milestones in children, now known as "Help Me Grow" (read more above).

Social-emotional deficits affect an estimated 5% to 20% of preschool-aged children, so such screening tools

are vital because early identification and treatment, specifically addressing mental health, can significantly impact an individual's long-term health and wellness.

Course instructors, supervisors and peers say Alison puts the same kind of energy and enthusiasm into her nursing work that she does as an avid marathon runner. She truly goes the distance for little ones and their families. Her problem-solving mentality enables her to easily mitigate challenges while remaining calm. She is a natural at connecting with people and ensuring that each patient receives a wealth of personal attention. Every day on the job, Alison blends the perfect combination of head and heart to address needs, find resources and ultimately improve the lives of many children and families in our community.
