This 2-part virtual training will increase leaders' knowledge of what *trauma-informed* looks like in concept and practice at the individual, agency and community level.

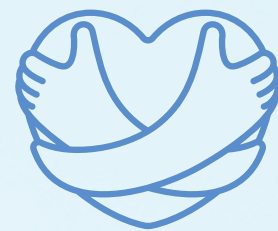
The training will include:
