

Spontaneousdepartures: flows and avalanches on steep slopes in the sun.


Triggers skiers: friable or hard plates especially at more than 1600 m.

Snowpack stability


- -Typical avalanche situation: significant layer of recent and fresh snow, still blown on Monday, especially at altitude with snowdrifts and heavy accumulations in places. During the last 24 hours, 30 to 35 cm of heavily blown fresh snow fell at more than 1200 to 1500 m.
 -Spontaneous departures: Tuesday morning, the natural avalanche activity will be very low or even zero given the extreme cold.
- -spontaneous departures. Tuesday morning, the natural availanche activity will be very low of even zero given the externe cold. Then in the middle of the day and in the afternoon, flows and avalanches of recent and fresh snow, of small to medium size, or even a few ruptures of the plates, could be triggered naturally on steep slopes in the sun, with possible aerosols of powder in places. Rare afternoon patches less than 1800 m in steep and grassy adrets.
- 1800 m in steep and grassy adrets.

 Triggers caused: given the accumulations of recent and fresh snow in recent days, often blown by winds from southwest to west, the risk of triggering more or less thick slabs depending on the altitude, will persist Tuesday during the day, at least on steep slopes (patches easy enough to break, in snow compacted by the wind near summits and passes, or crumbly patches in powder snow on steep slopes less windy, sometimes even at relatively modest altitudes). Beware of steep slopes with accumulations.


Fresh snow at 1800 m




Snow quality

- -The snow cover is good right down to the bottom of the lower valleys. You can put on skis around 700/800 m.
- -Quality of snow for Tuesday: fresh and recent snow, recently windy, especially at altitude, thick
- irregular, especially above 1800 m (accumulations, drifts, ridges and bumps sometimes less snowy). Best to ski less than 1800/2000 m (more regular and lighter).
- -Light humidification on slopes in the sun in the middle of the day and in the afternoon.
