


# Avalancherisk assessmentbulletin

(valid outside marked and open slopes)

## MASSIVE:CHABLAIS

written on Saturday,February27, 2021 at 4 p.m.

Risk estimate until Sunday,February28, 2021 in the evening



**Spontaneousdepartures:** wet snow + rare base plates

**Skier trips:** wet snow + rare old plates at altitude

Risk indices: 5 very strong - 4 strong - 3 marked - 2 limited - 1 weak - In black: the most dangerous slopes

### Snowpack stability

Dense snowpack, fairly well stabilized. Typical situations: wet snow, bottom slabs.  
Be careful of the risk of loosening on hard snow in the morning.


Spontaneous avalanches:

- a few flows or medium avalanches of wet snow (size 1 to 2) on steep sunny slopes during hot hours.
- rarely a bottom plate, size 2, possible at any time, mainly under 2400 m in adrets, 2000 m in ubacs.

Trips by skiers:

- surface flows on steep slopes moistened in the sun.
- rare old hard slabs, in rarely frequented ubacs, higher than 2400 m. Triggering unlikely, but locally a fairly thick breakout possible.



### Snow quality

Correct snowfall, good at altitude. You can put on your skis around 1000/1100 m in N, 1400/1500 m in S.

Very dense spring snowpack, sandy on most slopes. Poor night-time regel under 1600 m (deep wet snow). Higher: in adrets, hard snow or even icy snow in the morning, softening during the day. In ubacs, still cold snow, but often hard and puffed.


