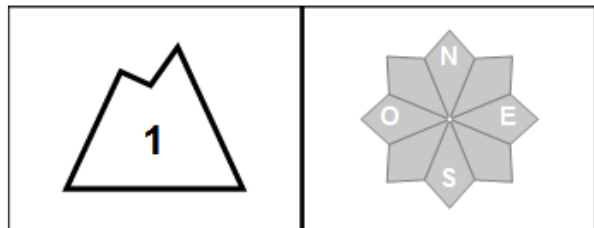

Risk estimation until Thursday 04 March 2021 in the evening



Low risk.



Spontaneous starts: wet snow + rare base plate

Skiers triggering: wet snow

Risk indices: 5 very strong - 4 strong - 3 marked - 2 limited - 1 weak - In black: the most dangerous slopes

Snowpack stability

Dense snowpack, well stabilized on most slopes.

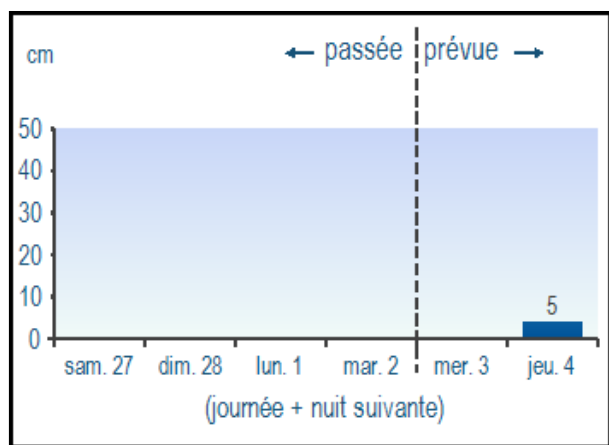
Spontaneous avalanches:

- after a good night freeze-up, a rare flow or avalanche of medium-sized wet snow can occur on Thursday on a steep slope warmed by the sun.
- rare base plate still possible, especially under 2400 m in adrets and 2000 m in ubacs.

Triggering by skiers:

- possible by cutting a steep slope moistened by the sun if the schedule is too late.
- very rare hard plaque, on shaded slopes higher than 2400 m. Triggering difficult.

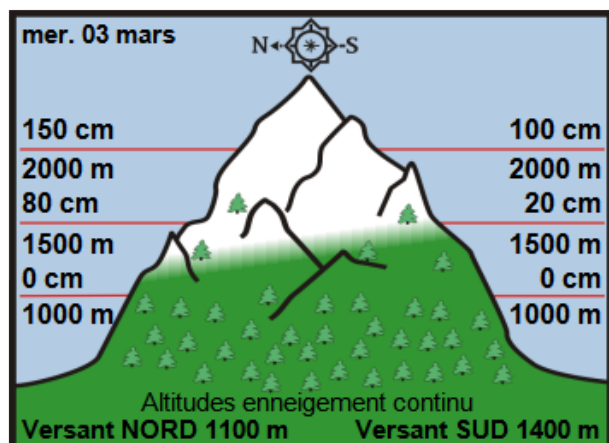

Snow quality

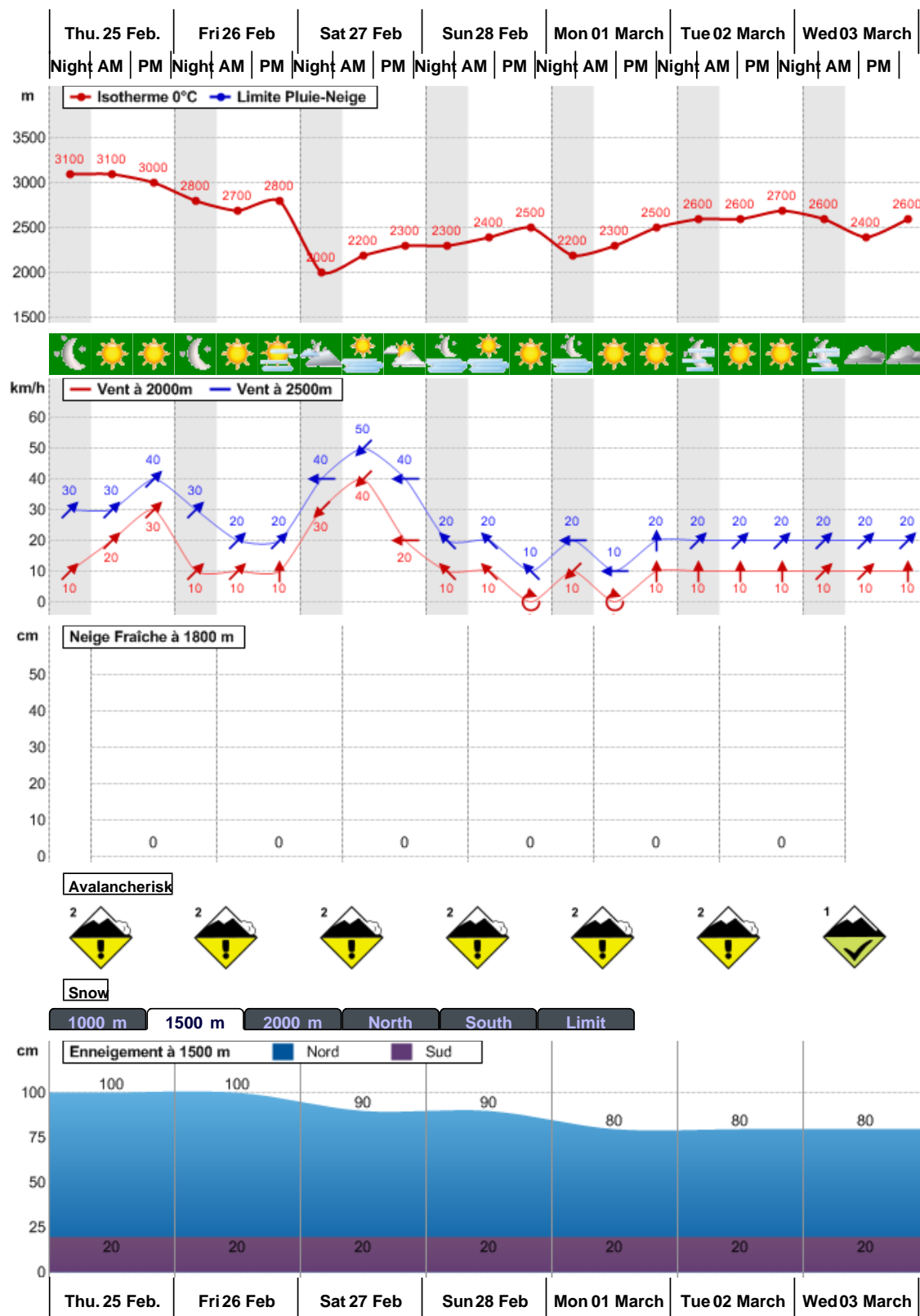
Good snowfall at altitude. You can put on your skis around 1200 m in N, 1500/1600 m in S.

Very dense spring snowpack, sandy on most slopes. Good night freeze. Superficial humidification during the day. Higher than 2000 m in ubacs, cold snow, often hard and puffy.
