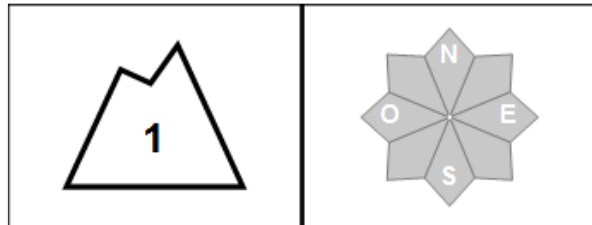
MASSIVE:CHABLAIS

Risk estimation until Monday 08 March 2021 in the evening



Low risk.



Spontaneousdepartures: unlikely.

Triggers skiers: rare plates (cold slopes of altitude) difficult to break.

Risk indices: 5 very strong - 4 strong - 3 marked - 2 limited - 1 weak - In black: the most dangerous slopes

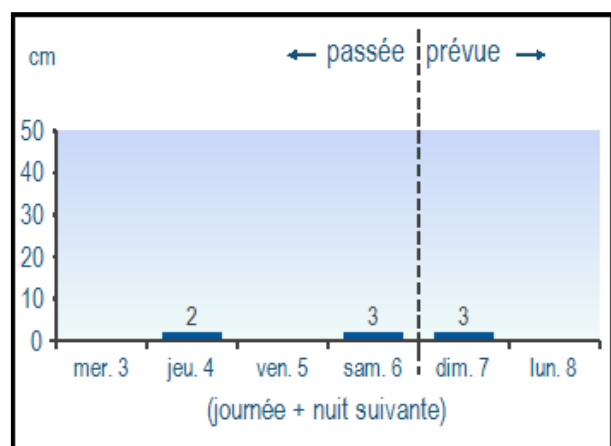
Snowpack stability

Apart from a thin layer of fresh snow on the surface, the snowpack is dense, often spring-like, and well stabilized on most slopes. On the steep slopes to the north at more than 2000/2200 m, under the small layer of fresh snow, you can still find old snow in fairly dense powder, but mostly blown.

Spontaneous avalanches: almost zero risk on Monday (very rare bottom slab on steep slopes not purged, less than 2400 m in adrets, and 1800/2000 m in ubacs).

Triggering by skiers: very rare hard patches on shaded slopes at more than 2500 m, barely buried under a layer of fresh snow. Triggering difficult.

Fresh snow at 1800 m



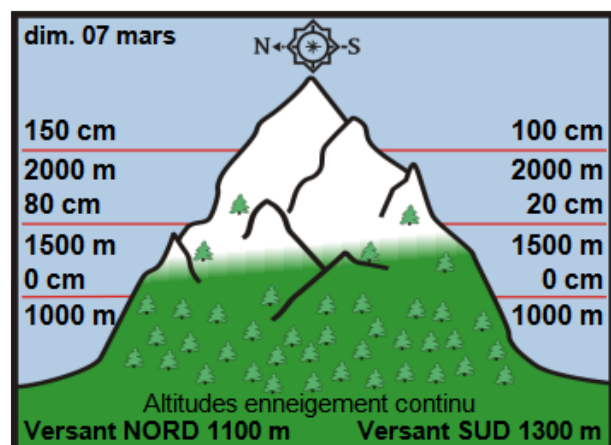

Snow quality

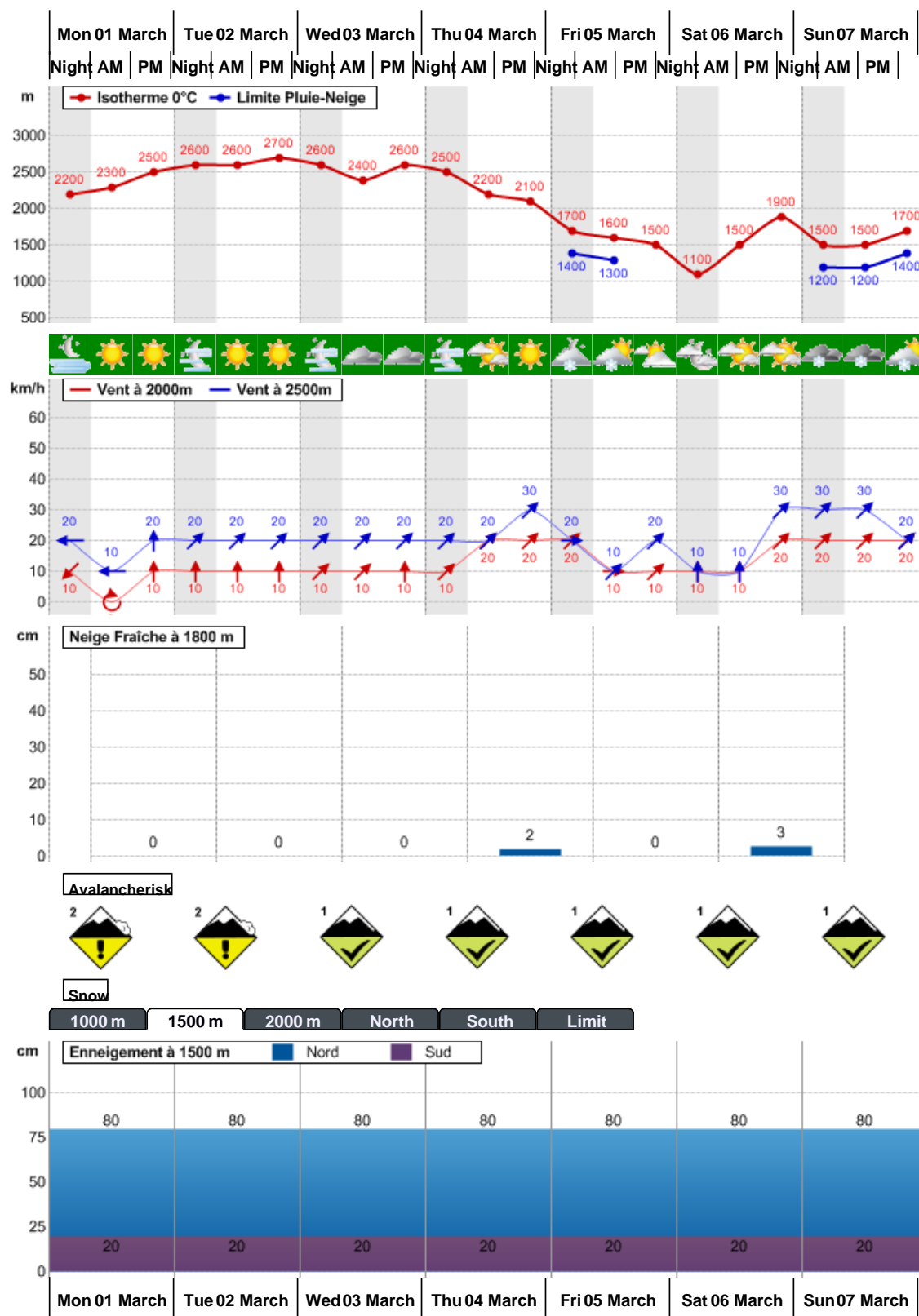
Good snowfall at altitude. You can put on your skis around 1200/1300 m on the north slope, and 1600/2000 m on the south slopes depending on the inclination.

Small layer of fresh snow on the surface above 1200 to 1400 m, covering a very dense spring snowpack, with traces of sand on most slopes. Humidification Monday at midday and in the afternoon under cloudy conditions on the south-east to west slopes.

At more than 2000/2200 m in ubacs, under the thin layer of fresh snow, cold snow, often hard and puffy.
