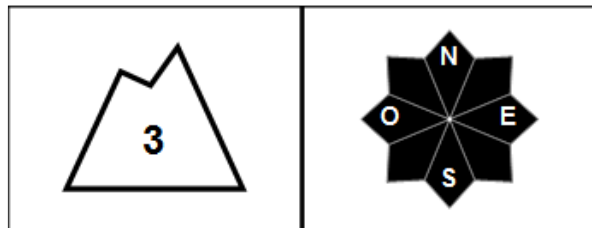
## MASSIVE:CHABLAIS

written on Tuesday, March 16, 2021 at 4 p.m.

Risk estimate until Wednesday, March 17, 2021 in the evening



Marked risk.



**Spontaneous departures:** Rare large avalanches this night.

**Triggers skiers:** Crumbly plates - Accumulations.

Risk indices: 5 very strong - 4 strong - 3 marked - 2 limited - 1 weak - In black: the most dangerous slopes

### Snowpack stability

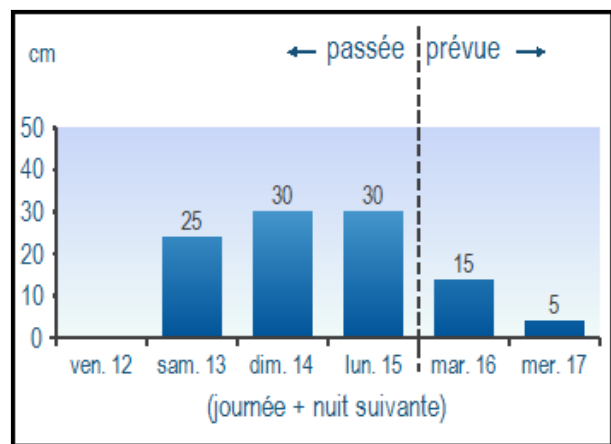
Typical situation: Fresh snow

Heavy snowfall over the last 3 days, in the process of settling.

**Spontaneous departures:** Tonight (Tuesday to Wednesday), with the new falls, we cannot exclude a natural departure on very steep slopes of large size. Wednesday, some flows, could occur in the rocky bars and the very steep slopes, especially in the event of clearings. Likewise, we cannot exclude a few rare bottom plates (creeping) in the adrets below 2000 m.

**Triggering skiers:** A few crumbly patches, generally thin, easy to trigger, will still be present on all slopes. In addition, in the ubacs, possibility of soliciting a large accumulation in a very steep slope with the key to triggering a large avalanche, but however unlikely.

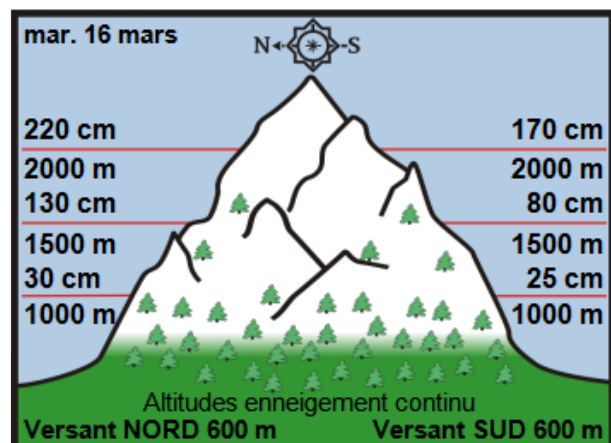

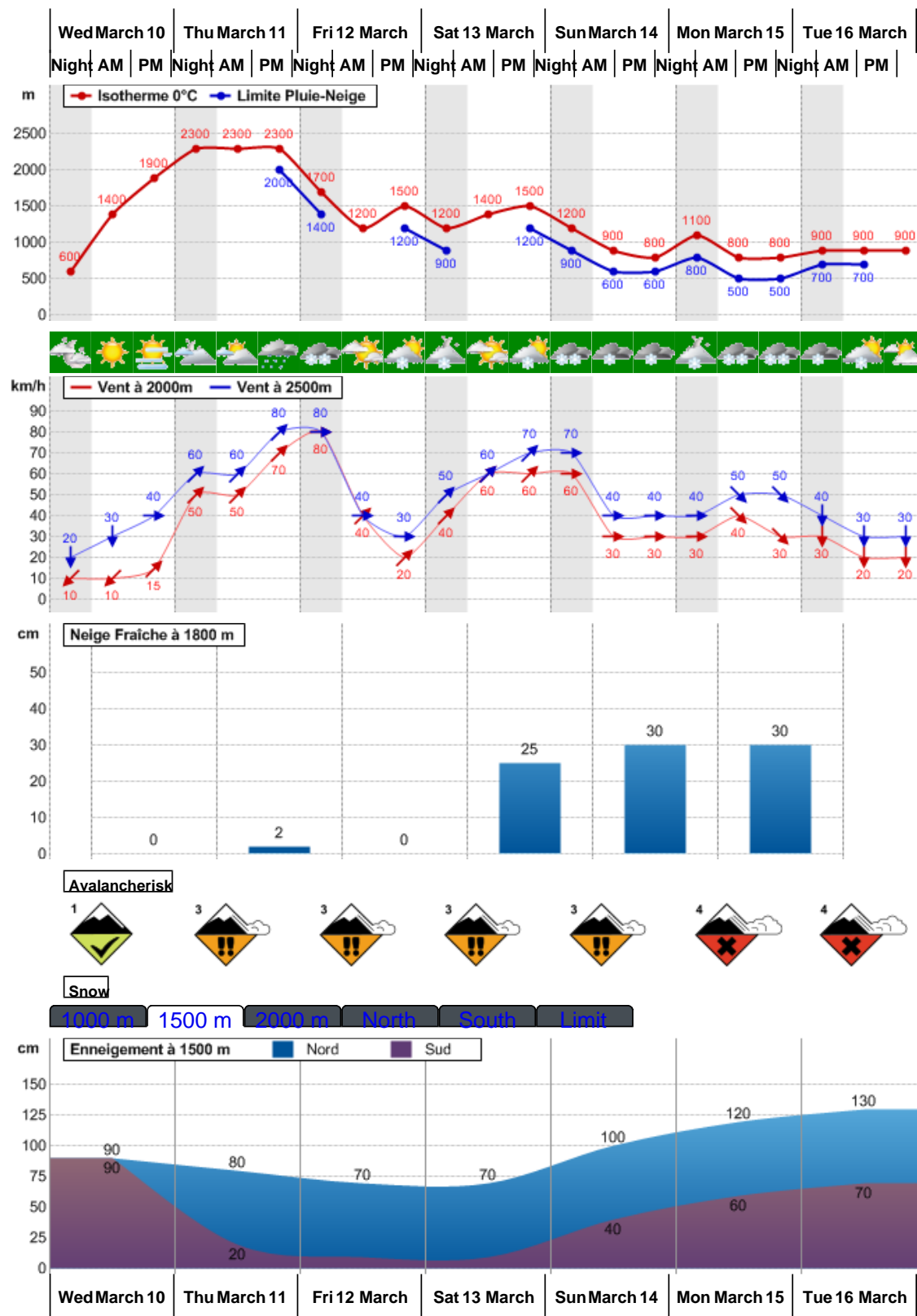
