Snow quality

Good snowfall for the season. You can put on the skis around 1200 m in the north and 1400 m in the south.

In the adrets, the snow is crusted on the surface and becomes humid during the day.

On the slopes in the shade, slightly crusted snow below 1500/1800 m. At higher altitudes, the snow is either more or less dense powdery, or compacted by the north to northeast wind.
