



Avalanche risk assessment bulletin

(valid outside marked and open slopes)

MASSIVE:CHABLAIS

written on Wednesday, December 16, 2020 at 4 p.m.

Risk estimate until Thursday, December 17, 2020 in the evening



Spontaneous departures: unlikely

Skiers triggering: a few patches on cold high altitude slopes

Risk indices: 5 very strong - 4 strong - 3 marked - 2 limited - 1 weak - In black: the most dangerous slopes

Snowpack stability

Bulletin written using reduced information.


Dense snowpack, packed by rain and warmth.

Spontaneous departures: the majority of purges have already occurred. Still a few balls on steep slopes near the rocks. Size 1 to 2.

Triggers skiers:

- at low altitude: unlikely, even if a skier can push heavy snow.
- higher than 2300/2400 m, still some fragile plates disseminated in the steep E, N and W slopes rarely exposed to the winds. They adhere poorly to an old, persistent fragile sub-layer, irregularly distributed (not active everywhere, therefore tricky...).




