Virginia Ave. Archie and Josephine had twelve children but only nine lived to maturity: Charles, Maurice, Josephine, Arthur, Paul, Harding, Berlin, Mable and Carl. Archie was a hard working family man and Josephine was a loving and dedicated housewife and mother who took the responsibility of raising her children seriously.

It was important to both Archie and Josephine to instill in their children to be honest, upstanding and hard working. The effects of their high moral standards were demonstrated when the country was thrust into World War II and later the Korean War, when all the Bailey brothers answered the call to serve their country. Their devoted commitment to the country was an inspiration to this entire community.

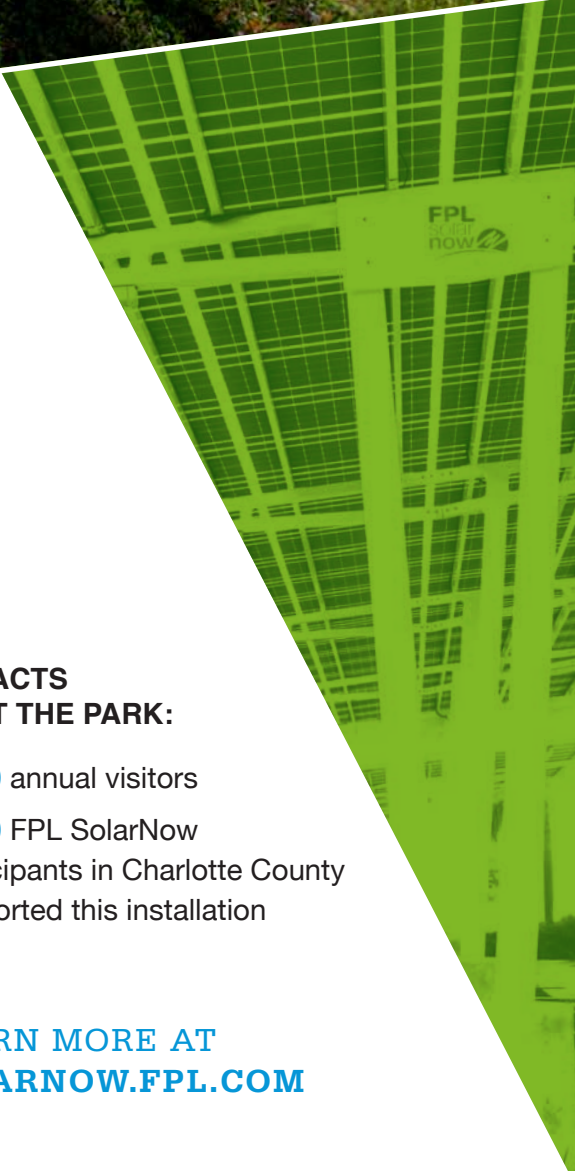
