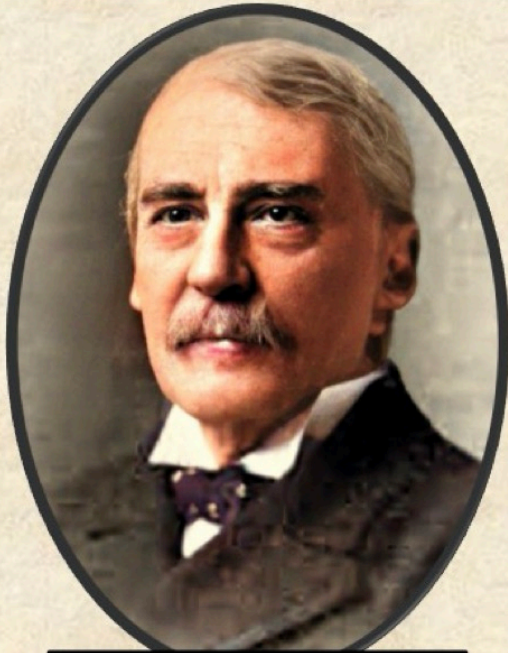
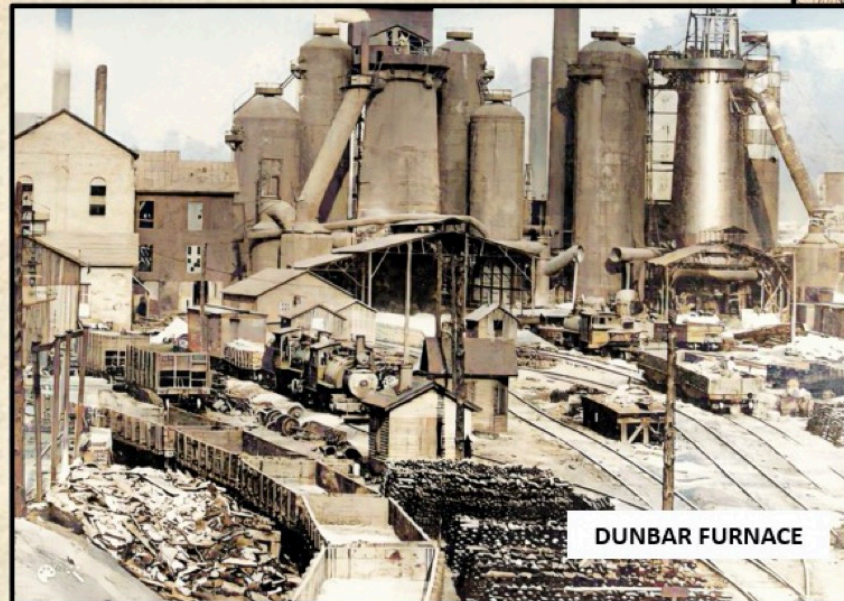


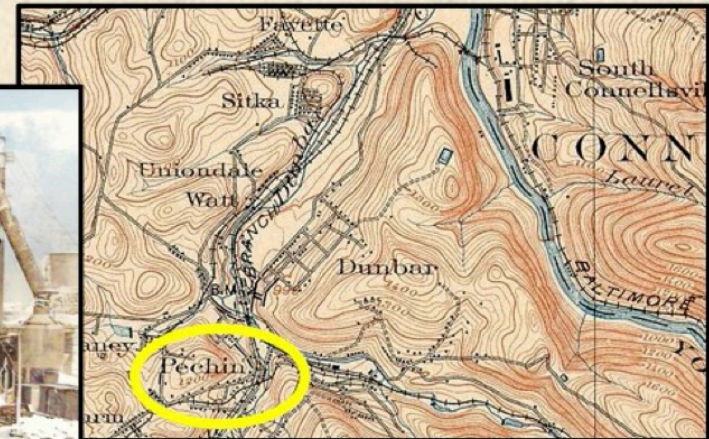
Edmund Cash Pechin (1834-1928) graduated from University of Pennsylvania in 1856. He then studied law and practiced from 1859 to 1868, when he became president and manager of Dunbar Iron Furnace Company, where he was for 8 years. He had sent Joseph H. Bramwell to the meeting as his representative because of pressing business.

Pechin was then for two years assistant general manager of the Southern States Coal, Iron and Land Company in Tennessee; afterward, he was vice president and general manager of the Cincinnati, Portsmouth and Eastern Railroad company, and from 1888 to 1892 was general manager of the Virginia Development company at Roanoke, Virginia. In 1892 he retired from active business to his country place, "Greyledge Farm," near Buchanan , Virginia,
