
Prof. Frederick Prime, Jr. (1846-1915) may be the only Founder to have his own







Prime graduated from Columbia in 1865 and studied four years at the Royal School of Mines, Freiberg. He was assistant professor at Columbia, professor of geology and metallurgy at Lafayette 1870-1879, and PA Assistant State Geologist 1874-1879. He was involved with several iron and electric companies in PA and Alabama and was President of the Edison Electric Light Company of Philadelphia from 1891-1893.



He became a professor of natural history at Girard College in 1895.
