Blessings Tree from Furman's Heller Service Corps

Every year, in December, the Heller Service Corps rolls out the Holiday Giving Tree program to benefit our local partner organizations where students volunteer on a weekly basis. If you aren't familiar with this program, students gather wish-lists from various nonprofits and schools in the Greenville community, and then place trees around campus with "ornaments" that list items you can purchase to benefit these organizations.

Usually, students, faculty, and staff take an "ornament" off the tree and purchase the listed item for the organization. This year, we won't be here in December, but we felt it more important than ever to support the wishes and needs of the organizations that have helped keep our beloved Greenville community afloat during this difficult time.

As a result, Heller is partnering with the Woodlands at Furman to help collect needed items for local organizations. We will be sending out a form with a list of needed items and their respective organizations. Residents can either go and purchase items on their own or turn the forms back into the front desk with the items marked that they would like purchased and Bethani & Ezra will go to Walmart and purchase the item on the resident's behalf. Residents using this method will be billed.

Forms will go out Friday, November 6th and all purchased items need to be in by Thursday, November 12th. Purchased items can be either brought to Apartment 1310 or turned into the front desk.
