Senior who is considered one of the more vocal team leaders... penciled in as the starter at one of the linebacker positions... shared Jim Carlen Special Teams Player of the Spring accolades with D.J. Smith... has played 37 games over the past three seasons, making 10 starts... has 14.5 tackles for loss among his 125 career stops.

2016: Played in every game, making seven starts... ranked second on the team with 75 tackles, including 46 solo stops, and was second with 8.5 tackles for loss... had eight games with six or more tackles, including a career-high 12 stops in the regular-season finale at Clemson... logged a pair of interceptions, picking off passes at Clemson and against USF in the season's final two games... earned the special team's Tenacity Award, as selected by the players following the season... set a then-career high with seven tackles at Mississippi State, including two tackles for loss... matched that with seven tackles, including one tackle for loss, vs. East Carolina... made six tackles at Kentucky... matched a career high with seven tackles against Texas A&M... set a new career-high with nine tackles (all solo) and added one tackle for loss against Georgia... had a big day in the UMass win, matching career highs of nine tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss while recording his first career full sack... finished with four tackles and a 13-yard sack in the Missouri win... made three tackles with a forced fumble and a fumble recovery against Florida... made six tackles in the Western Carolina win... earned the Jim Carlen Special Teams Player of the Spring accolades.

2015: Saw action in every game with one start... credited with 23 tackles, including 14 solo stops... recorded a career-high six tackles including a half-tackle for loss at Georgia... logged five tackles, including four solos, at LSU... saw his most extensive duty against Vanderbilt after T.J. Holloman was ejected for targeting... logged three tackles and picked off his first pass against the Commodores... had four stops, including a pair of tackles for loss, against Florida... made his first start of the season against The Citadel and responded with three tackles, including a tackle for loss, and a quarterback hurry... recognized with the Everyday Attitude award for the defense in the spring.

2014: True freshman who started the season at linebacker in a 3-4 scheme but moved to defensive end late in the campaign... played in 12 games, making a pair of starts... logged 27 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss... earned the start in the season opener against Texas A&M... joined Al Harris Jr. as first true freshmen to start a season opener since Jadeveon Clowney in 2011... recovered first career fumble at Vanderbilt... forced two quarterback hurries to go with three tackles versus Missouri... collected a season-high five tackles versus Tennessee... had his best game at Florida, collecting a half sack, 2.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble... started at defensive end and made three tackles against South Alabama... named to the 2014-15 First-Year SEC Honor Roll.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated from Cedar Grove (Ellenwood, Ga.) High School in 2014.... coached by Jimmy Smith... the Saints went 7-5 in his senior season, reaching the second round of the state AAA playoffs... earned Class AAA second-team all-state honors by the Georgia Sportswriters... earned a spot on the *AJC*'s Class AAA All-Metro squad... played in the U.S.

Army All-America Bowl following his senior season... collected 99 tackles with 22 tackles for loss including 16 sacks, three fumble recoveries and an interception, as a junior... was an AT&T Georgia Junior Bowl selection... recorded 64 tackles as a sophomore... Rivals considered him the sixth-best outside linebacker in the nation, No. 103 overall, and the 28th-best player in the state of Georgia... was Scour's 12th-best outside linebackers and rated No. 138 overall... 247Sports listed him as the nation's No. 6 outside linebacker, the seventh-best player in the state of Georgia and No. 96 on its Top247 list... ESPN considered him No. 162 on its ESPN300 list, the 10th-best outside linebacker in the nation and the 11th-best player in the state... ranked by *PrepStar* number 208 on the Top 300 All-American Team.

2016: Played in all 13 games, with a start at Mississippi State... had five receptions for 52 yards... caught one pass for 10 yards at MSU... caught two passes in South Carolina's win over East Carolina... had a career-long 29 yard reception at Kentucky... a member of the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

Sophomore who is the incumbent at quarterback after starting each of the final seven games of the 2016 campaign... talented performer with a strong and accurate arm... after one season, ranks first on the Carolina list for career completion percentage at 65.8... named the Joe Morrison Offensive Player in the Spring... owns a 4-3 record as a starting quarterback... worked as a counselor at the prestigious Manning Passing Academy in June.

2016: Started each of the final seven games after not playing in the first six contests of the season... was 4-3 as a starter... was 125-for-190 for 1,420 yards and nine touchdowns and just four interceptions... his 65.8 percent completion percentage ranks fourth in Carolina history for a single-season... shared Steve Wadiak MVP honors with Deebo Samuel... made his debut as the starting quarterback against UMass... went 17-for-26 for 201 yards and two touchdowns vs. the Minutemen... became the fifth Gamecock true freshman to start at quarterback in the SEC era... won his first career start against an SEC opponent as the Gamecocks upset Tennessee... completed 15-of-20 passes against the Vols for 167 yards and two TDs... connected K.C. Crosby for a 35-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that proved to be the game-winner against UT... improved to 3-0 as a starter and earned SEC Freshman of the Week accolades when he led the Gamecocks to a win over Missouri, going 22-for-28 for 254 yards and two touchdowns... connected on touchdown passes with Rico Dowdle and K.C. Crosby... his scoring connection with Crosby was the third-straight game the two players combined for a touchdown... became the first Carolina true freshman quarterback to win his first three collegiate starts since Steve Taneyhill notched four-straight wins in 1992... went 18-for-33 for 213 yards in his first road start at Florida... improved to 4-1 as a starter in the Western Carolina win, completing 14-of-23 passes for 154 yards... carried the ball five times for 34 yards against WCU and caught a pass on a trick play for 12 yards... set career highs with 32 completions, 43 pass attempts and three touchdowns in the Birmingham Bowl against USF... set the school record for bowl games and Birmingham Bowl records for passes completed (32), yards passing (390) and total offense (381) in the ovetime loss to the Bulls... passed on his senior year of high school to enroll at South Carolina in the summer of 2016... joined Kansas safety Mike Lee as the only two FBS players who could have been playing prep football in 2016... named the South Carolina Male New Student-Athlete of the Year... named to the 2016-17 First-Year SEC Honor Roll.

HIGH SCHOOL: Graduated following his junior year to enroll at South Carolina... threw for 2,834 yards and 28 touchdowns in 2015, leading the Bulldogs to a 12-1 record... coached by Brian Blackmon... grew up in Duncan S.C. and attended Byrnes High School as a freshman before his family moved to Alabama... ranked as the No. 5 pro style quarterback by 247Sports...Scout considered him the No. 9 passer in the class of 2017... was the second-ranked quarterback and the 33rd-ranked player overall in the ESPN Junior 300... selected to play in the Under Armour All-American Game.

Bentley was born Nov. 23, 1997... is an exercise science major... father, Bobby, is Carolina's running backs coach and previously was a highly-successful high school coach at Byrnes (S.C.) and at Presbyterian College...
